

The Fairyland is growing bigger We have a new friend called WMO I am going to run even further Nobody has to sit in a corner, anymore

My name is Ayesha I run and I fly I play with my friends I am aiming for the skies!

WMO firmly believes that every child, however disadvantaged, enjoys the right to play with his or her friends

Etch those couplets in your heart, remember her face, remember Ayesha in your thoughts and prayers.

This is the Journey of the World Memon Organisation **CHANGING LIVES** across the Globe.



This is the story of Mumbai, a Pandemic, an Exodus and the humble migrant worker.

This is the arduous journey of **Rehman** who was a daily wage earner in Mumbai, sending money religiously home to take care of his family and ailing parents.

The many poignant scenes of migrant workers clutching to their infant children and meagre belongings as they took to the streets to walk back to their villages were reminiscent of the days of the partition. The gut wrenching pictures replete with hollow eyes, ragged feet, parched throats, empty stomachs, broken spirits and unending roads bear a striking resemblance to the massive exodus of 1947 when the country was divided into India and Pakistan.

On the 24th of March 2020, the Prime Minister of India had announced a comprehensive and impetuous lockdown to arrest the spread of the Corona virus, leading to the hurried shut down of the country and killing the city's throbbing lifeline - the public transport system.

No trains, no busses, no metro services, no cabs, no auto rickshaws, just deserted roads. Mumbai was a ghost town. Restaurants, shops, offices, construction sites and all businesses across the city shut down. The migrant workers and daily wage earners who helped build and run the city were its first casualties.

Millions of migrant workers come to Mumbai from far off villages in the hinterland of India to earn a livelihood. The city has always embraced them and has been a generous benefactor, providing them with jobs, a steady income and a better life. But this time Mumbai had turned her back on them.

And then it began. As the jobs evaporated, money trickled to a halt and the hunger pangs grew, the country witnessed the greatest exodus since the partition. With no available mode of transportation to take them home, the roads were lined with families embarking on these never ending journeys on foot, to reach destinations which were several hundred miles away. Many never reached their villages. Rehman was one of them who succumbed along the way.

When the Corona pandemic ends, statistics will prove that the people in India who lost their lives to extreme poverty will far outweigh those who succumbed to the virus. Most migrant workers revealed scant symptoms of Covid-19 but yielded to the far more prevalent and fatal disease that has ravaged the country for years - hunger.

And while the citizens of Mumbai keep washing their hands with soaps and sanitizers, I doubt that they will ever be able to wash off the blood of the migrant workers. The exodus has left an indelible stain on the soul of Mumbai... and its deep red!

This is the story of Rising to the Challenge.

WMO has always answered the call of the unfortunate victims of a humanitarian crisis or a natural calamity in any part of the World. The organisation has been on the forefront and has contributed in every possible way to alleviate the pain and misery of those who seek refuge under these tragic circumstances.




The coronavirus crisis has upended the lives of millions, with no clear end in sight. The number of unemployed around the World has hit an all time high. The numbers are staggering.


Memons anywhere in the world can now link up

It was a gratifying learning experience working with the highest intellectuals in business and how we shall work for the betterment of our community.



The networking opportunities that were afforded me to interact with people from different countries has been the most invaluable experience for me.


Though we are all Memons and speak the same language it was interesting to see how different we were.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Background

An outcome of the Strategy discussion held by the Executive Committee in Dubai at the beginning of out tenure resulted in a delegation of responsibility to a number of sub-committees of which Audit, Finance and Zakaat committee was one of them.

The Power Devolution through the Sub-Committees has resulted in tremendous improvement in performance at the Central level.

Appointment of CFO

WMO recruited a full time CFO to the Centre who assists the Treasurer and the COO in aligning the chapter financial framework, book-keeping and accounting. In line with completing the book-keeping function we have implemented the SAGE online (cloud based) accounting platform during 2016/2017.

For the first time we were able to present the Audited Consolidated Financial Statements of the Europe, Pakistan and Middle East chapters for the Financial Year Ended December 2015. We have also presented Audited Compiled financial statements (including the rest of the Chapters not legally part of the consolidation) since the FYE December 2017. With this we have brought the accounting records of the chapters at the fingertips of the Treasurer and his team. Our Transparency is at a level like never before and the Audited Accounts and the Sub Committee Reports are testament to the strides we have made in this area.

Audit Finance and Zakaat Committee

The Audit, Finance and Zakaat Committee has done a wonderful job in getting the finances of the organisation streamlined and on One Single Accounting Platform. The Global Balance Sheet is a great achievement after 12 years of existence, and now WMO is self-sufficient wherein we can manage our current expenses with the return on investments. However, in order to better improve efficiencies across the chapters we need to hire qualified staff at all chapters and this will require more funding which we need to raise from the members.

In order to promote good governance and consistency of operational procedure across the all Regional Chapters, we developed a set of Policies and Procedures for the major critical areas of operations of WMO. These policies are designed to regulate and control the processes of WMO throughout the chapters globally in a consistant manner. The finance team headed by the Treasurer, implemented the said Policies & Procedures throughout the chapters starting from year 2016. With the implementation of these policies we have improved our internal control levels, segregation of duties and transparency in the book-keeping and accounting areas significantly.



The Zakat committee implemented a Project based Zakat distribution strategy where the Donors have the option of selecting the projects they want to support from a list of projects submitted by the Chapters and approved by the Zakat Committee. In order to facilitate this, the Marketing and Communication Committee has listed these projects in the Website and Mobile App since 2017. The Donors have the option of selecting the chapter and the project to route their Zakat to or pay to the Central Zakat Fund and the Zakat Committee will have the option of disbursing these funds based on need and priority. The monitoring and supervision of the Zakat distribution and the accounting & finance of these projects is done by the COO & CFO, who make half yearly visits to the chapters with the significant amount of collection and distribution.

Property and Investment Portfolio

WMO holds 30 properties in Dubai. Initially, only 11 were in the name of WMO. The remaining 19 properties were held in Trust in the name of Trustee Mr Ismail A Gadit on behalf of WMO. In 2018, we were able to navigate the regulatory framework of Dubai and transfer the 19 properties held in trust to an offshore company, "WMO Investment Ltd". This was a major accomplishment of the finance team. The next stage is to bring all 30 properties into a single DIFC Company. This proposal is currently pending discussion and approval by the Board of Trustees with hope to finalize it in 2021.

The seed money of WMO, i.e. the Trustee funds are being separated from the General Funds and disclosed separately in the AFS. These Trustee Funds and other excess cash equivalents are invested only in Sharia Compliant Instruments, throughout the chapters and at the central level. Trustees and Patrons with long outstanding subscription dues, were recategorized in order to implement an effective collection practice as per the constitution.

Overall very good progress towards a stronger Finance Function for the next Committee to build on.
