After graduating in Law from the University of Newcastle in 1984 Mr Nowsad Gani trained as a Solicitor specializing in Land and Property Law and continued practicing Law as a Conveyancer and Property Litigator until 1991.

In 1992, He ventured into Real Estate Development and is today Shareholder and Chairman of a substantial Business in Property Development and Investment in the United Kingdom. Ganco PLC, is the holding company of various SPV's specializing in Investment/ development and being a preferred supplier of commercial premises in London and the South East to multiples such as Sainsbury's, Tesco, Waitrose, KFC, Costa Coffee, NHS, Lidl, Etc.

In 1997, the Blair government introduced the public private partnership scheme for the NHS, and Ganco plc, was one of the companies which won a substantial tender to provide and lease Medical Premises to the NHS. The company has also ventured into residential development working with Housing Associations to provide Social Housing and developing for the Private Sector.

In 2015, Ganco plc, was granted Developer Status by the UK Governments Help to Buy Scheme and have since completed 8 schemes.

In 2019, Ganco plc applied to the Housing Corporation to become a for-Profit Registered Provider for Social Housing.

The Investment arm of the Business is now managed by Nowsad's two sons, Muhammed Sufian and Arshad who have joined the Family business as Directors.

MINUTES OF THE 17th ANNUAL GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING 2nd NOVEMBER 2019, DUBAI, UAE.

ATTENDING: ANNEXTURE I

ITEM 1: RECITATION FROM THE HOLY QURAN

The Meeting was called to order by WMO President, Mr. Solly Noor at 2.25 PM and followed by a recital of Qirath by Mr. Bashir Sattar.

ITEM 2: WELCOME ADDRESS BY MR SULIMAN NOOR MAHOMED (SOLLY NOOR), PRESIDENT OF THE WMO

President Mr. Suliman Noor Mahomed (Solly Noor) commenced his speech by thanking everyone for their presence including the Former President Mr Sattar Dada, Chairman of Board of Trustees, Trustees, Deputy President Mr Nowsad Gani, all other Office Bearers, members and staff of WMO and specially thanked Mr Ahmed Shaikhani and the entire Middle East Chapter team for a wonderful AGAM, Hosts of the Dinners and Mr Shahid Sangani. He then welcomed everyone to the 17th AGAM.

He informed that this year marks completion of 17 years of WMO and since 2001 none of us would have envisaged of where we are and what we have done. We have come a long way and we can proudly say that WMO is a global brand which everyone knows. We have 9 chapters all over the world who are the foot soldiers everywhere and we are a wonderful machine working seamlessly and we have to work even better

He praised the team for being available 24/7 and informed that we have to work within the rules and policies that have been set by the management council. Everyone has to follow the guidelines.

While we are happy with what we have done over the last year we could have done more and we expect the coming year to be better. With the election period coming over it is happy to note that people have shown interest in various positions and then announced that Sir Iqbal Sacranie has been appointed as the Election Commissioner.

Mr. Solly Noor concluded his speech by thanking everyone for their participation.

AGENDA 3: TO RECEIVE AND APPROVE THE MINUTES OF THE 16th ANNUAL GENERAL ASSEMBLY MEETING HELD ON SATURDAY 3rd NOVEMBER IN KARACHI, PAKISTAN

The minutes being circulated with the WMO Annual Report was considered read, approved by Mr Arif Lakhany and seconded by Mr Bashir Akuly..

AGENDA 4 - TO RECEIVE THE ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2018 – PRESENTED BY MR SHOAIB ISMAIL MANGRORIA, SECRETARY GENERAL

The Report circulated was read by Mr Shoaib Ismail and was approved by Mr Iqbal Dawood and seconded by Mr Arif Kachalia.

Mr Solly Noor at this time took the opportunity to thank all the sponsors who are always ready to support WMO and made special mention of Habib Bank who have been supporting WMO over the last 17 years.

AGENDA 5 – TO RECEIVE AND APPROVE THE CONSOLIDATED AUDITED ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST DECEMBER 2018 - PRESENTED BY MR YUNUS SULEMAN, TREASURER

Mr Yunus Suleman requested the audience to refer to page 30 of the Annual Report while presenting the report.

- Mr Yunus informed that we are always improving our presentation and becoming more transparent. He informed that the chapters have increased from 7 to 9 and form part of the compiled accounts.
- The total income has decreased by around \$600k specially because the zakat collections have gone down due to the economic challenges in the various chapters and restrictions in sending money from certain chapters. The distribution has gone down by \$100K, the operating costs have gone up due to new staff being employed and certain legal costs and other chapter operational expenses.
- Value of Properties in Dubai have decreased due to the impairment value of \$600K which is actually the contributor towards the deficit in our accounts.
- Balance Sheet, the properties have decreased in value to \$3.3 million. The current assets are higher and include cash on hand, zakat and investments.
- Regarding Zakat collection, Pakistan was on top followed by Africa. North India has already increased their collection under the leadership of Mr Ehsan Gadawala. Far East Chapter's collections have been good and their disbursements have been all local.



• Mr Yunus Suleman then highlighted where the Zakat was Disbursed. Mr Farooq Ahmed complimented the overall performance of WMO. He, however expressed his view that we are neglecting many families who are struggling to survive. Mr Ismail Gadit agreed with the comments and thanked him for his efforts and contribution and informed we need to do more.

Mr Solly Noor informed that while we agree we cannot do anything without funding and if all the members start contributing then we will be able to help many more families. He then applauded the finance committee for submitting a well-prepared report.

Q. Dr Shiraz Suleman asked about the Mutual Funds in Pakistan and if we will be continuing or moving the funds to better performing products. Furthermore, asked about the plans with the properties in Dubai.

A. Mr Gul Mohammed responding informed that the Pakistan Chapter is experiencing an economic issue and believes that the market will improve in 6 months' time and we will be able to recover the losses.

Mr Solly Noor informed that the property market globally is normally a deflating market. Our properties have only gone down 10% which is far less than the average and our income is good and the return on investment is good hence we would not be able to replace this.

Q. Mr Arif Kachalia informed that stock market is speculative and if it was halal to invest in this?

A. Mr Solly Noor informed that all investments made are shariah compliant. Further added that while the market in Pakistan is down, we are confident it will recover.

Q. Mr Farooq Ahmed informed that the non-monetary expenses are very high and asked how we can justify this?

A. Mr Ismail Gadit informed that the majority of this expense consists of the property impairment.

Q. Mr Farooq Ahmed then informed that we need to better classify as this is misleading as they are not expenses.

A. Mr Ismail Gadit informed that this was recommended by the Auditors to show this as expense and when the value goes up this will be shown as an income.

Mr Sattar Dada commented on the issue of Zakat and informed that we have a long way to go where with more members we are collecting less. The problem is lying with the chapters and the committee must take charge and visit the chapter and find out where the problem is and we cannot continue like this and we are far from where we should be.

Mr Solly Noor agreed with Mr Sattar Dada and informed that Zakat will be a parallel thing of WMO and requested all the chapters that their primarily role for zakat is the international Zakat fund and meet the targets.

The compiled accounts were proposed by Dr Shiraz Suleman and seconded by Mr Ehsan Gadawala.

The consolidated accounts were proposed by Mr Ehsan Gadawala and seconded by Mr Gul Mohammedi.

AGENDA 6 - TO APPOINT AUDITOR(S) IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 40 OF THE WMO CONSTITUTION, TO HOLD THE OFFICE TILL THE CONCLUSION OF THE NEXT AGAM AND TO FIX THEIR REMUNERATION.

The present auditors have consented to continue as the Auditors for

2019 and the ExCo was given the Authority to decide the fees and to get the confirmation of the Auditors. This was proposed by Mr. Haroon Mohammed and Seconded by Mr. Faizan Wahid.

AGENDA 7 – TO APPROVE ANY AMENDMENTS TO THE GOVERNING DOCUMENTS (IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLES 24.5.2 TO 24.5, 35.1.3& 46.2 OF THE CONSTITUTION.)

Mr Nowsad Gani informed that the committee was unable to abide to the timeline for submitting the proposal and informed that this will be addressed next year.

Mr Solly Noor informed that several proposals have been received which will be discussed and addressed at the next AGAM.

AGENDA 8 - ANY OTHER MATTERS WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

Mr Solly Noor requested Mr Ahmed Shaikhani to address the gathering who thanked everyone and welcomed everyone to Dubai for AGAM.

Mr Majid Ranani was awarded a token of appreciation in recognition for his promising and delivering of legacy projects in India. Mr Majid Ranani thanked Shaikhani Family, Mr Ehsan Gadawala, Mr Iqbal Tabani and Mr Haroon Karim for their support and contribution in completing the projects.

Tokens of appreciation was given to the hosts of the AGAM Mr Ahmed Shaikhani and Mr Khalid Dhedhi, the supporting staff, volunteers and the sponsors for their contribution towards the success of the AGAM.

Mr Ahmed Shaikhani next requested Mr Salman Iqbal, Mr Khurram Kalia and Mr Junaid Merchant to inaugurate the trophy of the Memon League with WMO President Mr Solly Noor.

Mr Junaid Ahmed Merchant next presented details of the Memon League (M10) which will be an ongoing league held in Sharjah, UAE which will be the biggest event anybody has seen from a social platform and conducted in similar standards to ICC cricket matches. He introduced the governing council of M10: Mr Salman Iqbal, Mr Nowsad Gani, Mr Bashir Sattar, Mr Ahmed Shaikhani, Mr Junaid Ahmed and Mr Khurram Kalia. He then introduced the Title Sponsor of the league as Karachi Kings.

Mr Junaid Ahmed further informed of an upcoming event in collaboration with the Ladies Wing which is the Memon Sports Mela to be held on 10th January 2020 open to all the community members.

Mr Ahmed Shaikhani at this time called all the sponsors to received their tokens of appreciation. He further stated that as a charitable organization we depend on sponsors to host events and the sponsors are always behind WMO to support all the events.

Mr Solly Noor opened the floor to options for the next AGAM and informed that London, Dubai, Cape Town were available options. Mr Nowsad Gani further informed that 2020 will be the year of elections hence the location should be finalized based on the ease of obtaining Visa. Sri Lanka was also proposed as an option. While Dubai was proposed as the most suitable option there were concerns due to Dubai 2020 which is to be inaugurated on 20th October 2020. It was then unanimously accepted that Dubai will be the next AGAM venue.

Mr Solly Noor acknowledged the work done by Mr Mahmood Shaikhani who while being thousands of miles away has been constantly available and supporting the work of WMO, he then opened up the floor for questions.

Q. Mr Abdul Gani informed that every year it is informed that the proceedings will be held in Memoni but it is not being done.



A. Mr Solly Noor apologized for this and informed that going forward this will be kept in mind.

Q. Mr Qadir Usman raised an issue on education support in Pakistan which has been going on for many years and now no new students are being accepted and the numbers are reducing with students graduating and at this rate there will be no more students being supported. The chapter is complaining that they don't have sufficient funds. The center had promised to support the chapter and requested to consider the request.

A. Mr Solly Noor informed that work is being done to sort out the issues in Pakistan and is expecting things to be resolved in the near future.

A. Mr Altaf Jangda informed that they have received guidance from Mr Haroon Karim, Mr Shoaib Ismail and Mr Ahmed Shaikhani and assured that this will be resolved.

Q. Mr Anis Arfa informed that many housing applications are pending in Pakistan and no new applications are being entertained. Requested to look into this as well as this is the need of the people.

A. Mr Shoaib Ismail informed that a policy was implemented where in the beginning around 1200 houses was given to the needy and rental support is also being provided. Due to the funding limitations it is not possible to address this and thus the focus should be on education first and when there are sufficient funds this will be looked into.

Q. Mr Majid Ranani informed that India Chapter has become stable now but there is no permanent Office and the office changes with the change of VP and requested that a permanent office is required. He further informed that in 2005 funds was approved for India but still this issue is ongoing. He further stated that membership and zakat collection will also increase if there is a permanent office.

A. Mr Solly Noor agreed with Mr Majid Ranani and requested to help collect funds.

Q. Mr Junaid Ahmed informed that there are many schools in Karachi which are not operating and recommended to adopt such schools which will give more leverage to WMO. Further suggested approaching Memon developers for discounted properties in Pakistan.

A. Mr Shoaib Ismail acknowledged the suggestions and informed that the option for school adoption is under discussion. Mr Solly Noor further informed that this will be looked into.

Q. Mr Shafi Mulani informed that in India since 2004 education project is being carried out. He appealed that the center give focus to Education Project in India to resolve the crisis of the students.

A. Mr Solly Noor informed that we need to work on this and will look at it.

Q. Mr Haroon Sacranie speaking about membership informed that the membership structure is sad and proposed to abolish the fees for ordinary membership and reduce the Life Membership to 50% and this way we will have more members and be able to network more, create more awareness of WMO and raise more Zakat.

A. Mr Solly Noor informed that this is being discussed by the committee and requested help from Mr Haroon Sacranie to bring forward the Memons in Malawi to be part of WMO.

Mr Gulaam Abdoola informed that we are a charitable organization to serve the poor which is the foundation of WMO and everything else are value additions. Every year we come to the AGAM and listen and go back and everything is over. He agreed with Mr Majid Ranani's request for the office in India which was a sensible request. In the previous years'

requests were made at meetings and money was raised immediately. Bringing this old tradition alive members got together and made pledges of \$135K towards the office in India. Of these Pledges \$90K has already been collected while \$35K commitment is from members in India who will be paying locally.

Mr Gulaam Abdoola thanked everyone for their support and further informed that we are failing in our Zakat collection and both India and Pakistan need Zakat and appealed to everyone to contribute their Zakat to WMO and encourage others to contribute as well. He stated that the chapters have to work hard to collect the Zakat and they will be pushed by Mr Solly Noor and Mr Sattar Dada.

Mr Ahmed Shaikhani at this time introduced a project of adopting a student for AED 1000. He further added that Shaikhani family will adopt 500 students.

Mr Solly Noor at this time informed that the Legacy Projects are happening at the various chapters and stated that 2 legacy projects were approved for Dubai as well. A video was shown to the audience of a legacy project (WMO Retirement Village) where \$1 million was raised in South Africa. Mr Feizul Ayob played another clip to show the land donated in Sibaya by former WMO President Mr Sattar Dada. Mr Solly Noor informed that works on all the legacy projects are in progress and we will celebrate once they are ready.

Mr Bashir Sattar requested Mr Arsalan Hashmani, GYW Vice Chairman to present a video on the Titan Project that had concluded and praised Mr Arsalan and his team for taking this event to another level and informed that this project be rolled out to all the other chapters.

Mr Solly Noor at this time informed that Mr Jan Muhammed Gandhi has just committed PKR 10 Million towards the Education project in Pakistan and further requested others to contribute as well.

Mr Solly Noor thanked everyone for attending and making this AGAM wonderful.

Sir Iqbal Sacranie informed that what Mr Gulaam Abdoola did was revive the tradition of the founder of WMO Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob and requested to carry on this tradition at every meeting.

There being no other business the AGAM was concluded with Dua by Mr. Iqbal Dawood.

SECRETARY GENERAL'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2019

Respected President of WMO Mr. Solly Noor, Chairman of WMOCF Mr. Haroon Karim, the Office Bearers of WMO & WMOCF, the Members of the Board of Trustees, the Members of the Management Committee, the Office Bearers of the Regional Chapters, Members of the Regional Management Committees and all members of WMO. Assalamu Alaikum.

It gives me great pleasure to present before you the Report of the Secretary General of WMO for the year ended 31st December 2019.

The theme of this AGAM is RISING TO THE CHALLENGE because it has been a mixed year around the world and at WMO with so many things unfolding, which were never ever imagined before. The COVID-19 Pandemic which started in December 2019 has set a chain of events rolling resulting in the economies of all countries coming to a standstill and both the rich and the poor have been deeply affected.

A similar situation prevailed at all Chapters of WMO. First there was the lockdown. Later, restrictions were still enforced on public gatherings and movement of people. The Pandemic has caused our respected donors to reduce their donations because their businesses have been deeply affected. Routine activities like Committee Meetings and execution of projects were delayed. For this very reason, the 18th Annual General Assembly and other related meetings were decided to be held Online.

We, at WMO, have to keep up with the changing times and face the challenges that are confronting us. Where there is a will, there is way. As you are aware, the various chapters of WMO have been hard at work, despite the lockdowns, and had launched very effective COVID-19 Relief Projects, that includes distribution of cash and rations to those people whose livelihood suffered greatly due to the lockdowns. The WMO also worked hand in hand with other healthcare organizations to fight the war against Coronavirus. Medicines, Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), Beds and other Essential Equipment's were handed over to healthcare institutions for the treatment of patients and for the safety of their healthcare personnel.

May Almighty Allah guide us to serve humanity in the most befitting manner in these difficult times. Ameen.

The WMO has now grown from Seven Chapters to Nine Chapters. The two new chapters are WMO Southern India Chapter and WMO Northern Africa Chapter. The performance of the Chapters, although the Annual Performance Report have detailed information about their activities, I wish to highlight the main points very briefly.

Southern Africa Chapter

The WMO Southern Africa Chapter will soon be launching its first ever Legacy Project, which is an establishment specifically catering for the needs of the elderly in the Raslouw area, South Africa. The Southern Africa Chapter, under its social welfare projects, offers monthly financial assistance to both Memons and Non-Memon Muslim families which include Funding of monthly groceries, rental, electricity & water bills, school fees & university fees, & textbooks, clearing of outstanding medical bills & medication and ongoing commitment to widows & orphans as the need arises. Besides, the Chapter, especially its Ladies Wing, does a lot of charity visits and makes generous donations in cash and kind to other like-minded organizations, all round the year particularly during the Holy Month of Ramadan. We are pleased to note that the Youth Wing of the Chapter has also actively conducted some events.

Europe Chapter

The Europe Chapter has its own unique welfare system. Professional services and financial assistance are provided for legal, medical, housing, social issues, immigration matters by respective professionals for Memons who cannot afford them. Hospitalization expenses and funeral charges are also given to needy Memons. The Chapter is also working on a Business Directory and conducting a Memon Census.

The Youth Wing of the chapter includes the Youth Wings of Memon Association Leicester and Memon Association UK where the Youth meet regularly and also organizes cricket, football, volleyball, basketball, badminton and other indoor activities.

The 2019 Global Memon Youth Convention Europe Chapter was a great event attended by 200 Memons where the WMO GYW's vision, strategy and achievements were outlined. The audience included undergraduates, post-graduates, professionals and entrepreneurs who enjoyed the presentations and speeches.

The Ladies Wing of Europe Chapter are also very active in fundraising locally and supporting welfare activities in various countries. A Memon Connection matrimonial service, which is operated by the Ladies Wing, introduces young adults and their families on a regular basis. The Ladies also hold weekly badminton and basketball classes for girls.

Far East Chapter

The Gift of Sight Project in Pakistan is primarily supported by the WMO Far East Chapter. Healthy cornea from Sri Lanka Eye Bank Society is flown to Karachi and all expenses incurred for the collection and dispatch to Pakistan is borne by the WMO Far East Chapter. This is, indeed, a very noble project because the eyesight of scores of needy people in Pakistan has been restored due to cornea transplants.

Another important scheme at the WMO Far East Chapter is the Microfinance Scheme which was started in 2013, wherein over 145 applicants have been provided with loans. The chapter also contributes large amounts of money for the relief and rehabilitation of victims of various disasters.

In the field of education, apart from the various Education support provided to the Needy Memons, the WMO Far East Chapter is also supporting various local schools namely Darussalaam Maha Vidyalaya, Al Hijra Muslim Vidyalaya, Fathima Muslim College and Al Minhaj College by uplifting their school facilities and providing teaching facilities to ensure that the children get the best education.

The Ladies Wing of the Chapter organizes regular Women Empowerment Programs which includes their flagship project "Memon Mela", social gatherings and other events from time to time. The Global Youth Wing of the Chapter is also very active, Ma Sha Allah.

Middle East Chapter

World Memon Organisation Middle East Chapter is one of the most diversified Chapter and consists Memon families from Pakistan, India, Sri Lanka, South Africa, & UK residing in the United Arab Emirates. The Middle East Chapter not only does social and welfare work locally but also generously funds projects of other Chapters, particularly Education projects. This enables thousands of students in Pakistan to pursue their school and college education. The month-long Iftar Program caters to thousands of people during the holy month of Ramadan. Ration bags are also distributed during throughout the year. A Memon Day Event was also held where about 300 dignitaries participated.

Among the projects undertaken locally in the UAE, the financial assistance to prisoners is a unique project wherein prisoners who have completed their sentences but have no money to go back home are provided repatriation along with Debt, Rental & Housing Assistance Programs.

The Youth have been very active. The Memon Share Event was held during Ramadan. Besides, the Memon Youth Convention, Memon Matrimony Event and M10 Cricket Events were also held. The Ladies were also very active at WMOME and had held various welfare events during the year under review.

The Middle East Chapter was the host to the 17th AGAM and other Meetings from 27th October to 3rd November 2019. We are extremely thankful to the entire team for the excellent arrangements and warm hospitality.

America and Canada Chapter

The WMO America and Canada Chapter has its own exclusive dynamics since the Memon Community is scattered all over the USA and Canada. The Chapter has the enormous task of coordinating with the Memons spread all over but has been very successful in achieving significant milestones. Key members of the Chapter had made trips to Austin &



Houston in Texas state and New York in the USA and also to Toronto in Canada during the year 2019.

The Chapter also held various Gatherings, Sports Events, Fundraisers, Zakat Collection Campaigns and Award Ceremonies. The sports event included the MPL Cricket Tournament (WMONA was the Platinum Sponsor) and the Chicago Memon Cricket Night (WMONA was the cohost).

Regarding welfare projects, the Chapter has joined hands with other WMO Chapters to execute welfare projects. Among them, the Empowering through Inclusion (ETI) project and the Bridal Dress Project are significant.

Under the ETI Project, the WMONA and WMO Pakistan Chapter were able to evaluate and design specific treatment plans for special needs children to provide physical, speech and occupation therapy. Many of these children were provided with necessary tools such as Wheel chairs, walkers and hearing aids to assist with their daily living.

The Bridal Dress Project provides brides-to-be with once used Bridal and Party Dresses. The Ladies Wing of WMO North America collected gently worn bridal and other party dresses and sent them to Pakistan to be distributed to the needy families.

The America and Canada Chapter has a total of 70 members including 2 trustees and 1 patron. On behalf of WMO International, I wish the chapter greater success in the future.

Northern India Chapter

India is a very large country with a widely scattered Memon population. Most of the Memon families come under middle-class or lower-middle class and are in need of some kind of assistance. As you are aware, the India Chapter was divided into Northern India Chapter and Southern India Chapter so that welfare work can be better managed.

The WMO Northern India Chapter is doing a wonderful job since its formal registration in 2014. It is mainly working in the fields of housing, education, health, microfinance and matrimonial assistance. Other activities include flood relief work, Medical Camps, Distribution Camps, Mass Marriages, etc. Sports events like Memon Football Premier League and the Memon Premier Cricket League have been held. Various types of get-togethers are also held regularly. The list is endless Masha Allah and all credit goes to the team at WMO Northern India Chapter who have established an effective system working parallelly across various cities in Northern India.

Masha Allah. I sincerely wish the chapter even greater success.

Pakistan Chapter

The WMO Pakistan Chapter is one of the oldest and largest chapters of WMO. Since its inception, it has been the pioneer in launching mega projects especially with regard to housing and education such as the WMO Rehabilitation Project, Education for All Scheme and the Higher Education Scheme.

In the recent years, the chapter has also launched projects in healthcare, social upliftment and socio-cultural fields. Under healthcare, the Chapter is running the Gift of Sight Project wherein free corneal transplants are provided to needy Muslim patients. Also, the Thalassemia Project is striving to prevent the spread of Thalassemia and also alleviate the sufferings of Thalassemia patients and their families. The Empowering through Inclusion Project (with the support of WMO North America Chapter) is focused on the identification of Special Needs Children, their diagnosis and treatment and in helping the parents learn how to cope with their children.

There are other social upliftment programs at WMOPC such as distribution of rations and cash. For self-employment, motorcycle distribution scheme has been launched while one-time used bridal dresses would be distributed to needy brides-to-be under the Bridal Dress Scheme.

The ladies and youth of Pakistan Chapter are very active and regularly hold events for the welfare, upliftment and well-being of the Memon community in particular and the general public.

Southern India Chapter

The year 2019 has been a year of great accomplishments for the WMO South India Chapter despite it being a new Chapter. Under the able leadership of Mr. H.E. Abdul Aziz (Vice President & Trustee) and Mr. Adeel Aziz (Regional Assistant Secretary), the Chapter has 68 Life Members and 31 Annual Members.

A lot of events and programs were organized by the Chapter which included Zakat Master Class (where a booklet "Zakat Simplified" was also launched), Gala Dinner, Memon Health Day (in three cities i.e. Bangalore, Hyderabad & Chennai), Fakhr-e-Memon Awards, Ilim-e-Deen Master Class, Project Mohabbatein (Eid Milad-un-Nabi), launch of mobile job app in the name of Professional Hub, Mega Job Fair, RENDEVOUS 2020 Conference and Education & Career Counselling program.

REPORT FOR THE YEAR 2019

Global Youth Wing

Since 2017, the World Memon Organization's (WMO) Global Youth Wing (GYW) is working under the leadership of its Chairman, Mr Bashir Sattar and in coordination with regional WMO leadership to enhance the footprint and impact of WMO as well as prepare potential future leaders to take forward the WMO legacy.

At the 17th WMO Annual General Meeting (AGM) in Dubai GYW showcased their annual accomplishments and contributions. The GYW conference acted as a curtain raiser with around 300 attendees. It was evident at this event that Mr. Bashir Sattar has been successfully able to identify and recruit some of the crème de la crème of the Memon youth in the GYW team. The young leaders apprised the audience about their projects ranging from business conferences and capacity building initiatives, social and networking events as well as physical and mental health improvement initiatives. These projects envisage to fill the socioeconomic gaps within the Memon community by identifying and addressing the community's most pressing needs like provision of affordable education, quality healthcare, and facilitation of matrimonial matchmaking, micro social entrepreneurship and youth empowerment. It was heartening to see that these dynamic young individuals have built their own teams under the guidance of the Chairman and are adding to the WMO legacy. With such dedicated and hardworking young people coming into the organization, WMO can be confident that the future of the organization is secure in the capable and innovative hands of the young leaders. GYW owes its contribution to the continuous cooperation and assistance of the office bearers of the chapters including the regional vice presidents, regional assistant secretaries, and regional assistant treasurers.

GYW - PAKISTAN CHAPTER

Pakistan has an exceptional asset in the shape of youth, which means that the largest segment of our population consists of young people (64 percent of the population is below 30 years of age). Pakistan is the second youngest country in South Asia and one of the youngest countries in the world. The young population of the country can translate into economic gains only if the youth have skills consistent with the requirements of a modern economy. For this purpose, two key initiatives were undertaken by GYW Pakistan to develop business leaders of future. The projects are further elaborated as follows.

Titans 3.0

Titans – the flagship event of WMO GYW Pakistan Chapter is designed with the vision to develop entrepreneurial acumen of young people hence contributing to the development of the countries where they choose to live

Titans provides our youth with a platform for learning, growing and idea sharing. Titans also inspires the youth by offering them the opportunity of structured networking. The Titans Conference is the annual focal point for respected, successful, affluent & influential Titans, students, working professionals, homemakers and entrepreneurs.

Titan 3.0 was attended by over 1,000 delegates and had 30 business leaders as speakers from around the world specifically for this event.

The panel of invited guest speakers were carefully selected to ensure a diverse mix of ideas, perspectives and backgrounds as we explored some of the big questions and carefully curated sub themes underpinning the conference. Discussions revolved around creating awareness of non-conventional industries where investments could be placed, and work opportunities created; thus creating "microprenuers" so as to convert welfare seekers into enablers and to facilitate technological growth that has helped many countries progress. Topics such as animal rights, morality and how to maintain harmony within the community were also discussed.

This year we went out of the box and conducted multiple activities that are rarely seen at business conferences. The most spontaneous session was conducted by Mr. Aqil Sattar of AQ Power Yoga. The lights dimmed and the ambiance turned calm and relaxing. With soothing

music Aqil had everyone on their feet, jumping about performing exotic yoga moves. Even the community stalwarts and business leaders participated. It was truly engaging as everyone in the audience followed the different asanas.

The session was followed by Junaid Akram, the audience got really excited as the viral sensation and social media influencer took over the stage. He spoke about time management and his journey as an influencer. The audience was truly motivated, and were inspired by his journey as a comedian.

Titans 3.0 demonstrated that if a community comes together, they can make a tremendous impact.

Accelerate

Accelerate is a business accelerator program that inducts existing, working businesses for a period of 6 months. The goal of the Accelerate program is to help businesses achieve a higher financial scale. During the 6 months the businesses are analyzed for the root causes of growth hindrances. Businesses were then provided with expert training, in partnership with the leading incubation centers of Pakistan, mentorship and business networks to help them achieve their planned and desired scale. Businesses will also be introduced to funding channels (venture and private equity) and high net worth individuals to provide opportunities for investment. Around 10 startups presented their work at accelerate but in 2019 none were selected to be a part of the program. However, crucial feedback was given to presenters on their business models which will help them review their innovations for scale up potential.

GYW - MIDDLE EAST CHAPTER

Memon Share

The WMO is a global hub to bring all Memon community members together with the single motto of "All for one and one for all!" WMO organizes a number of welfare, educational, entrepreneurial and public service activities in accordance with its annual activity plan set forth by the esteemed leadership every year. These activities reflect the vision and mission of WMO and are focused to uplift the healthcare and standard of living of the Memon community around the world. Memon share program is an online application that was launched to reflect the vision of WMO and initiate technology-based programs that can help WMO communicate its impact, goals and activities with larger Memon audiences across the world and to bring together multiple WMO National chapters on a single platform.

One of the activities includes the distribution of used / unwanted Items which includes used clothing, toys, tools, electronic items, household products, utensils and much more among the underserved community members. These items are generously donated by the Memon community members to their local district chapters and later passed on to the deserving gentry through a channelized system. This activity has been carried out for generations within the Memon community on local levels as part of our culture. However, through Memon share, the collection and distribution of used items can now be kept in record, collection and distribution can be made in larger numbers from and to specific locations and monitored through a centralized application. In the first consignment of the year, we dispatched 343 KG of used/unwanted items to the needy people in Pakistan, and 2nd consignment has been collected with each item being tracked and accounted for.

Another initiative of Memon share is that donors who could not become members of the WMO shall now be able to register as our proud members at WMO and become valuable contributors in community development through multiple avenues.

Memon Youth Convention

Youth is considered as the backbone of any community. Memon youth



is known for its zeal, energy and passion to learn, grow and contribute. The Memon community is blessed to have a strong combination of young blood and our rich values of community based collective growth which has anchored the name of Memon community as global pioneers in entrepreneurship and social development. However, with the ever expanding technological advancements and fast paced lifestyles, the Memon youth has remained disconnected with the core vision, mission and activities of the WMO. This identified a strong need to re-connect the young memons on a joint platform to bring them together and educate them about the pioneering services of WMO. For this, the WMO Youth Convention was organized whereby, young participants were informed, educated, trained and empowered with relevant knowledge about the milestones of WMO and how they can play their role in taking the mission forward.

The response to WMO Convention was overwhelming, a total of 147 participants attended the event out of which 74 participants were registered as members.

Memon Matrimony

GYW believes in adopting the cultural changes happening in the world keeping in mind the sensitivities of our religion and also to keep our Memon community connected. The Memon Matrimony program was initiated based on the smaller programs which have been in place within the community. The program encompasses around identifying progressive memons looking for a competitive marital partner. The program invites families and individuals, generates a general profile of each candidate and helps those individuals in finding the most suitable life partner in lines with the community and cultural values of Memon families.

During this program, interested candidates were invited with their parents for a one to one meeting with another candidate with similar profile match, thus enabling them to understand each other's personalities, needs, goals and values so they can make an informed decision for selecting a life partner. Compared to the traditional way of profile sharing, we believe that it is important for the people to meet and understand each other first. The Memon Matrimony Program works as a facilitator in helping people to find their better half and live their lives according to the prescribed Sunnah of Holy Prophet Mohammad (SAW)

M10 CRICKET LEAGUE

Nelson Mandela had famously quoted, "Sport has the power to change the world. It has the power to inspire. It has the power to unite people in a way that little else does." The GYW Middle East Chapter followed in the footsteps of the legendary Nelson Mandela and organized a spectacular cricket tournament to unite Memons from across the Middle East. Karachi Kings M10 league brought together several teams and players from across the region. In the first week of November 2019, the league was officially announced at the AGM in Dubai and the trophy unveiled by the illustrious ARY family who were the driving force behind the event. The Cricket League's anthem made a debut with much fanfare on the 20th of December and subsequently a gala dinner launched the league at the iconic Address Hotel in the first week of January. The gala was graced by a galaxy of stars, along with the top brass of the WMO Middle East Chapter. All the eight team owners and players made their presence felt at the glitzy event with their vibrant cricket jerseys being unveiled. Spread over a period of three days, from the 9th of January till the 11th and hosted at the World class Sharjah Cricket stadium, this cricketing spectacle proved to be quite a hit, as Memons from across the Emirates came out in full force to cheer for their teams. Each boundary got the crowd on their feet, every dropped catch drew a gasp and many close matches had the spectators on the edge of their seats. The matches went late into the night with the finals being scheduled for the 11th of January. However due to inclement weather conditions the finals were washed out and the two winning semifinalists - Realtors United & Shaikha Daredevils were both crowned as the joint champions of the first Karachi Kings M10 League. Based on the overwhelming response and judging by the size of the crowds, we can humbly state that the first Karachi Kings M10 League was a colossal success. The event would not have been made possible without the tireless efforts of Mr. Salman Iqbal, Junaid Ahmed, Mahmood Shaikhani, Ahmed Shaikhani, Khalid Dhedhi, Kamran Ghani, Imran Farooq and Khurram Kalia who provided steadfast support towards organizing an event of such scale and magnitude. We are also very grateful to all

our sponsors and the team owners for endorsing the event. Though entertainment was one small aspect of the Karachi Kings M10 league, it presented a crucial platform to our youth to showcase their talents to the World. The spectacular cricket tournament brought in sizeable crowds, uniting not only Memons from the Emirates but also people from all corners of the globe who have migrated to the Middle East over the years and now call it home. Memon Youth Convention

Since the launch of the GYW in 2017 much has been achieved to implement the strategy and structure of this initiative, but we also understand that much is still to be achieved. Through this event GYW ensured some quality time for them while also demonstrating a strong value for family and respect for ones elders.

A New Life

Mental health is an integral and essential component of health. Individuals having sound mental health realize their abilities, cope with the normal stresses of life, work productively and are able to make a contribution to their community. Hence promotion, protection and restoration of mental health is vital for development of individuals specially youth. Realizing the need, GYW East Chapter conducted an interactive session on the subject of Depression including postpartum depression. The objective of this session was to create awareness, reduce stigma and start an open dialogue on challenges faced by individuals going through mental illnesses especially in postpartum period. People expressed openly about their issues and vulnerabilities. They expressed the need to have community organized support groups to help young people and new parents to seek professional help when needed. The need for more such sessions was also highlighted.

Community service remains at the heart of WMO. The orphanage was visited the Global Youth Wing Far East Chapter who took up the responsibility to uplift their dining areas for the children to sit and eat.

GYW - North India Chapter

As committed in AGM at Dubai of achieving Inter-Community Development by focusing on the development of the youth, with a roadmap based on sustainable development and self-sufficiency, the youth committee of WMO NIC indeed left a lasting impression.

Key Initiatives Conducted by WMO NIC Youth:

Project Mohabbat: Project Mohabbat was conducted by WMO team all over India. The main idea behind to carry out this project is to spread love, care, concern, affection by reaching the needs of all age group. It was held on Eid Milad-un-Nabi. Our team has classically plan, design, organized and executed this project to deliver help, care, and concern, and love, happiness with the act of charity or humanity. Our team not only reach Memons but Non-Memons at the same time, not only Muslims but other as well including children youth and old age. This initiative was conducted in more than 75 cities with an aim to gift a smile.

NRC Camp was held in Surat.

Memon Premiere League was held from 5th to 9th February 2019.

Memon Football League featuring 12 teams was organized in Mumbai.

Youth Conventions were held in Rajkot, Dubai and Bhavnagar.

Raincoat Distribution Drive and Bag Distribution Drive was held in Mumbai.

Memon Youth Parliament: A one of its initiative to provide a platform where the youth of the community can express themselves. Youth from across the nation raised issues and passed resolutions to solve those issues.

The Seven Resolutions passed at Memon Youth Parliament:

- Framing a uniform constitution for the Memon Committee: This resolution endorses of drafting and framing of a uniform constitution for the Memon community for Pan-India jamats to follow. It will draw attention and emphasize the need of role, responsibilities, duties and operative conditions for its members. With the help of the above resolution, a framework of policies will be designed which will be uniformly adapted across India. This resolution will play a major role for boosting uniform intercommunity development.
- Health Insurance & Disaster Management Training for Memon Community. Heath Insurance: This resolution expresses deep concern about the lack of seriousness regarding the need of health insurance. A survey with regard to the non-insured people in the region will be conducted and those not insured will be made

aware about the benefits of health insurance. The community will work out cheap and subsidized medical insurance cover for the non-insured. Once implemented, this resolution will provide all expenditure of pre-hospitalization and post hospitalization, so that no one in our community will face financial problems for their families to provide medical support. Disaster Management Training: This resolutions draws the attention about the amount of loses that can occur when we are not prepared to face a disaster. It focuses on setting up of disaster training centres at all the jamat khanaas spread across the country.

- Each One Teach One: This resolution urges for creation of a new age knowledge sharing platform for the youth and with Each one teach one, they not only get a unique platform which aims for cementing the future of the youth, they also get a platform which allows them to express themselves freely thereby inculcating freedom of expression in the community. Each One Teach One is a unique resolution which is practical and easily executable. It needs minimum investment but promises maximum returns. With a thriving channel on a social media platform, and a one of its kind knowledge sharing platform combined with a community of youth incubated, whose energies have been channelized by the prolific seniors of the community, Brand Memon will cement its future and how! Let's not witness change, let's be the change as the best way out is sometimes through it. This resolution will not only lead to sustainable development but also lead to self-sufficiency within the community. Let's be ready to learn, unlearn and relearn with Each One, Teach One.
- Education institutions (K-12 & Religious Studies) for Deen & Duniya: This resolution focuses on balancing general and religious education together. A child should be able to get the education of Deen and duniya in equal measure. With the help of this resolution, institutions will be created pan-India which will lead to the development of a new and evolved Memon community of the future as our children of today are the custodians of our future. This will lead to sustainable development of our society.
- Mandatory Ladies Wing and Skill Development for Memon Youth: Mandatory Ladies Wing: This resolution is indeed the need of the hour. It focused on establishing a mandatory ladies wing in every jamat to empower woman like never before. This will not only ensure women empowerment but will even help the women in gaining confidence to face the world. Skill Development for Memon Youth: This resolutions recommends the formation of Memon Skill development Corporation i.e. MSDC. This organization will have its regional centres which will identify the need of skill based training in its region and implement it accordingly. This organization will help the Jamat to design and implement skill development schemes as per their requirement.
- Committee for Memon Community Development: This resolution focused on better utilization of community fund by giving soft loan to businesses, and by helping widows, old age parents. It will lead to provision of loan facilities for higher education, start-ups, and soft loans, for middle class families. A new financial institution that will help the Memon community to get the loan facilities will be created with the help of Memon community and WMO. WMO will setup nationwide infrastructure for the disbursing soft loans for middle class families. WMO will identify widows/ old age parents who are in a position to run small scale business and help them with micro finance type loan. The remaining widow/old age parent will receive monthly financial help for their maintenance and also for their kids
- Digitalization of Fund Management and Implementation (Zakat and Lillah Amount): This resolution draws the attention for the need of transparency in both collection and utilization of zakat and Lillah Fund. There is a need for an online platform for the same which will reduce the tedious process of physical collection and will lead to better governance on funds received and its utilization.

TREASURER'S REPORT

Assalamu Alaikum Warahmathullahi Wabarakathuhu

We have presented the audited consolidated financial statements of WMO chapters for Financial Year ended 31st December 2019, for the 18th AGAM in December 2020. . The Consolidation is based on the following Audited Accounts.

- 1. Southern Africa Chapter
- 2. America & Canada Chapter
- 3. Europe Chapter
- 4. Far East Chapter
- 5. Middle East Chapter
- 6. Northern India Chapter
- 7. Pakistan Chapter
- 8. South India Chapter

Over the years we have achieved greater consistency in the policies adopted across the chapters and improved the presentation for better transparency and accuracy of the Audited Accounts. We are happy to report that the Pakistan Chapter accounting policies and estimates have been revised to be in line with the approved accounting standards comprise of such International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRSs) in line with ICAP directives for "Accounting Standard for Not for Profit Organisations", similarly in Far East and Africa.

The presentation of the Northern India and Middle East Chapter financials have not adopted fund based accounting presentation, as they had to adhere to regional standards for charity's even though our book-keeping is maintained on the fund based concept throughout the chapters. We are trying to mitigate this difference as much as possible to exclude this inconsistency and are hopeful that other chapters would adopt the presentation methodology and disclosures required under the latest IFRS Rules before the next Audit. The Consolidated financials are prepared eliminating these inconsistencies and in line with appropriate policies and best practices.

As per the financials the Zakat collections for 2019 (Approx. \$3.3mn) with a 10% growth compared to the previous year, the main contributors were:

- Far East is the highest zakat collecting chapter during the year 2019, the collection has increased by over 40%. The donor's confidence over the Zakat committee is the main reason for the increase.
- 50% increase in North India Chapter collection
- Middle East maintains the collections at similar levels, despite the Restrictions imposed on Dubai Banking operations remaining stringent.
- After 4 years South Africa has fallen short of the committed zakat amount, which is closer to 30% in their usual collections
- Pakistan's collections fell by 40% compared to 2018
- Europe collections have been impacted drastically due to Zakat being distributed by the donors directly to the beneficiaries or given to the chapters in kind, this is a result of the various constraints posed by some of the countries.

The Zakat distributions of over \$3.3mn, as usual mainly focused on Education schemes for Pakistan & North India and Housing in Northern India. There is a major drop in the housing / Rehabilitation projects in Pakistan mainly due to insufficient collections and temporary slowing down of funding for own houses. During the year Northern India Chapter has increased its Zakat distribution mainly for Education and Housing projects in comparison to the previous year. Africa Chapter have spent 75% of their collections on local projects such as Widows and Orphan assistance, Education, Bursary, Medical, etc.. Middle East spent their local collection on the local welfare projects including loan settlements, Ramadhan projects and legal assistance. 100% of Far East Chapter collection was utilized only to support the Sri Lankan Memons for Education, Housing, Medical and Self Employment. Far East Chapter also used specific zakat for "Gift of sight" project to send healthy corneas to Pakistan.

The collection of Trustee fees during the year 2019, is slightly lower than that of the preceding year with a total collection of \$ 142,500, and this amount is only disclosed in the statement of funds. Currently the number of WMO Trustees stands at 50, with the inclusion of 3 new

members. Membership subscriptions have gone up during the year due to South India Chapter inclusion and new patron's enrolments in various chapters. However, the overall collections from Annual members shows a reduction due to inefficient collections by the chapters and mainly 2019 is not being an election year.

We would like to highlight the reduction of total overheads by \$100,000 compared to previous year. The WMO House property in Pakistan have been revalued during the year and the revaluation surplus accounted for the year is \$310,100. However, the auditors of the Pakistan chapter have stated in their qualified opinion that the fair value of the investment properties (net of ejection and demolition cost, if any) was not determined as at December 31, 2019. Chapter management is of the opinion that auditor's qualification is of a technical nature that the said property is not in good shape and therefore it is not possible to obtain a reasonable market value. The NBV of the above Investment property as per the Statement of Financial position is \$14,350.

This year also the income from properties in Dubai saw a dip by 8%, due to the continued dropping property market in Dubai,. WMO would like to thank Leisure Homes for managing this portfolio for WMO free of charge in a very professional manner.

Sharia compliant Investments have escalated during the year and hence we could see an increase in other Income.

African chapter divested all of its investments in listed companies with a profit of \$17,000. These funds were now been placed on fixed deposits and have earned a significant return during the year. Due to the improving economic/market conditions in Pakistan, the two Mutual Fund investments have gained in value in comparison to the year 2018, and the unrealized loss has come down by 30% to \$30,000.

The significant cash and cash equivalents as at the balance sheet date consists of mainly the unutilized Zakat funds of Pakistan, Europe and Middle East Chapters, which were utilized by March 2020. This also comprises of savings account balances consisting of the Micro finance funds, matured short-term investments and its returns, which were reinvested only in the following year.

The financial year 31st December 2019, ended with a Net Asset value of \$ 8mn including the unutilized fund balances. This carried forward funds will be utilized during the year 2020, to comply with the Sharia principles. The main contributor to the increase in net asset value is the revaluation surplus recorded for the year.

I take this opportunity to highlight the following areas that require improvement in the future:

- America & Canada, Northern and Southern India chapters have curtailed the usage of sage accounting platform during the year, due to various regional restrictions.
- Complete Audits in line with scheduled timetable as a few Chapters were delayed by as much as 6 months.
- The attention paid by the Regional Treasurers and the RMC towards Management Accounts needs improvement. We hope the RMC officials would consider this and monitor the Management reports in the future.
- No proper follow up was done on the continuous implementation of WMO Policies by most of the chapters during the year. RMC shall ensure the implementation of policies and continue monitoring of same on a regular basis.

Overall, we have moved closer to the target of being an efficient international charity. The chapters shall continue to follow implementing the WMO policies and procedures and monitoring same by the office bearers. In Sha Allah, this will lay a strong foundation for WMO to grow from strength to strength in a more transparent manner that will result in recognition by the global bodies resulting in a significant increase in membership and Zakat collections in the future.

Notes to the Consolidated Financial Statements

1. Accounting Policies

a) Accounting Convention

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with the Financial Reporting Standard for Smaller Entries (effective April 2008), the Companies Act 2006 and the requirements of Statement of Recommended Practice, Accounting and Reporting by charities.

b) Incoming Resources

All incoming resources are included on Statement of Financial Activities when the charity is legally entitled to the income and the amount can be quantified with reasonable accuracy.

c) Resources Expended

Expenditure is accounted for on an accrual basis and has been classified under headings that aggregate all cost related to the category. Where cost cannot be directly attributed to particular headings they have been allocated to activities on a basis consistent with the use of resources.

d) Foreign Currency

Monetary assets and liabilities denominated in foreign currencies are translated into dollar at the rates of exchange prevailing on the balance sheet date. Transactions in foreign currencies are recorded at the date of the transactions. All differences are taken to the statement of financial activities.

e) Financial Assets / Investments

- i. Held to Maturity: These are non-derivative financial assets with fixed or determinable payments and fixed maturity that the chapter has the positive intention and ability to hold to maturity.
- ii. Instruments Designated as availablefor-sale: Listed investments classified as available for sale. Financial assets are carried at fair value which is calculated by reference to the stock exchange closing prices at the balance sheet date.

f) Bank Profit Receivable

Return on Investment/Bank profit share on funds held on deposits are included when receivable by the charity.

g) Fund Accounting

Unrestricted funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the trustees. Restricted funds can only be used for particular restricted purposes within the objects of the charity. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or when funds are raised for particular restricted purposes. Designated funds are funds set aside by the trustees out of unrestricted general funds for the specific future purposes or projects.

h) Shariah and Zakat donations

The WMO complies with Shariah law as provided in the Holy Quran and Sunnah.

i) Taxation

As a registered charity WMO is exempt from taxation of income and gains to the extent these are applied to charitable objectives.

3.0 Projects

Empowering through Inclusion project

Persons with Disabilities (PWD) are unfortunately often neglected members of society. They are mocked and shunned, rejected by their families, and many of them get mental depressed and lose their will to live. WMO NA together with WMO (Pakistan) decided to make a difference in the lives of these individuals. In February 2019, a collaborative project was developed with the help of WMO PC to empower these physically weak and mentally disadvantaged individuals. This project focused on empowering, treating and assisting children with special needs.

The Empowering through Inclusion project is near and dear to our hearts. The project facilitators visited 72 families. Our RMC Member, Zahida Taufiq Ahmed, travelled to Pakistan and conducted one on one interviews with family members to gain knowledge of the current



physical, mental and financial situation of the families. With the valuable information obtained we were able to evaluate and design specific treatment plans for these children to provide physical, speech and occupation therapy. Many of these children were provided with necessary tools to assist with daily living. Wheel chairs, walkers and hearing aids were provided. In some cases their wheel chairs were upgraded and improved in an effort to help the children maintain a normal life.

Even with all our effort thus far. There is much more than can be done and needs to be done. Each family faces enormous challenges while raising a child with special needs and it is our duty as a community to do our best to help in whichever way we can.

Bridal Dress Project

WMO NA ladies wing are extremely passionate and concern about the plight of underprivileged brides in our community. The dowry and clothing are still a very important concern in the lives of poor families. Typically the families especially those that have more than one daughter face the impossible task and financial stress when it's time to get them married. The families' face depression and anxiety when they have to deal with this challenge. Ladies Wing of WMO North America developed a wonderful plan to help combat this problem. They started a project in collaboration with WMO PC for these underprivileged brides and their families. They collected gently worn bridal and other party dresses and sent them to Pakistan to be distributed to the needy families.

Marriage expenses are increasing day by day due to the increasing cost of materials and labor. The girls belonging to low income families are facing great difficulties to get good wedding and party dresses in their budget as wedding and party dresses cost in hundreds and thousands of rupees.

WMO NA ladies wing collected 262 gently worn wedding and party dresses and 33 new blankets from various cities of USA and shipped the first consignments to Pakistan during December 2019.

We would like to recognize WMO NA ladies wing chairperson Ms. Zahidah Taufiq Ahmed for initiating and leading the project and Mohammed Anwar for not only arranging the shipment logistics but also bearing the to-tal cost of shipment. Thanks to all of our supporters and ladies from USA for their participation and con-tribution.

We also like to thank Mr. Qasim Lawai and Mr. Shoaib Ghaziani from the Pakistan Chapter for playing a lead-ing role in this project, Raunaq-e-Islam School, Federal B Area, Karachi, for providing storage and display facil-ities. And the Girls of Safura Home who washed, ironed and sorted the dresses.

Chicago Memon Cricket Night

WMON NA and Chicago Memon Association organized a spectacular cricket tournament to unite the Memons from across the Chicago land area. On the 14th of June we jointly hosted the first Memon Cricket Night at the suburb of Glen Ellyn, on the outskirts of Chicago city. 4 teams from different regions of the Chicago metropolitan area participated in the tournament. The North Side emerged as the champions of this tournament. The Memons community came out in full force to cheer for their teams and this was a colossal success. We are very pleased and excited with the encouraging response to the cricket tournament. WMO North America Chapter shall follow up with many more sporting events in the coming months to unite not only the Memon community but people from all corners of the world who have migrated to this great nation and now call it home.

Meetings

We had one board meeting during 2019, four meetings of the office bearers and various conference calls between BOM and office bearers. One phone meeting took place between office bearers and the auditors. Numerous calls between office bearers took place over the year to sort out various issues pertaining to the WMO.

WMO is registered in the Charity Commission and the Europe Chapter since the inception of this organisation has been assigned the responsibility to get the accounts audited from a qualified Chartered Accountant and to fulfil other statutory filing requirements in respect of Companies House and HMRC, which Alhumdolillah Europe Chapter has successfully fulfilled those duties.

Zakat Collection & COVID 19 Pandemic Collection

The WMO in conjunction with the Memon Association UK and Memon Association Leicester made great efforts to collect zakat. More than five hundred zakat Appeal letters highlighting the WMO activities were sent out by emails before and during the month of Ramadan, which resulted in the awareness of WMO among the memon community. With the efforts of senior members and Board of Management new donors were approached, who have committed that in future they would pay their zakat to WMO. Many calls had been made by officer bearers to the potential donors. All in all we received a good response from our Memon Community. However, due to the pandemic situation all over the world and in Europe active Zakat collection drive could not be made because of the lock down situation. Management is hopeful that once the pandemic situation gets better then zakat collection drive would be up and running.

We have collected \$152k towards our zakat commitment of 2019 and a shortfall is \$268k. In 2020 so far WMO Europe Chapter has collected around \$112k (£86k) and making more efforts to reach their target for 2020.

Also, due to the pandemic situation all out efforts have been made to collect funds from Europe Chapter which can be used for the different projects in UK and community at large have contributed around £52k (\$68K) so far.

Welfare Activities

The Europe and especially UK has its own welfare system which provides legal aid, housing supports as well as different kinds of benefit support and medical facilities. However, for our Memons who can not afford, we are providing free services in respect of legal, medical, social issues, etc. by the respective professionals which are also advertised on the website. We intend to have regional advisors giving advice on matrimonial, family disputes etc. This year round we got several calls from Memons regarding their issues, i.e. housing, family, welfare and immigration matters, where they had been advised appropriately by discussing their concerns and to come up with practical resolution.

We support some of our Memon's with hospital expenses and funeral expenses if they are having financial difficulties. WMO Europe Chapter work hand in hand with our Apex Body Memon Association in London and Leicester.

A Memon Connection service exists which introduces young adults and their families. Eight ladies from the Ladies Wing have been designated to operate this service under the supervision of the Convenor of the Welfare Department.

The ladies committee is having good progress in introducing the marriage introductions among Memons and every year at least 30 to 35 introductions take place.

Youth Wing

The Youth wing of WMO Europe Chapter consists of Youth Wing of Memon Association UK and Memon Association Leicester.

The Youth Wing has been active in the provision of cricket, volleyball, basketball and badminton activities at both the Memon Centre in London & Leicester.

Every year we usually organise 4 functions with the help of Memon Association UK. However, this year we could not arrange functions as Memon Centre is undergoing refurbishment and due to Covid 19 pandemic. The youth have taken a key role in assisting with the organising of social events and their input and participation is ever increasing, Alhumdolillah.

In 2019 following limited activities have been undertaken by the Memon Association UK and Memon Association Leicester in collaboration World Memon Organisation (Europe Chapter):

- 1. Badminton
- 2. Youth cricket is every Thursday's at MC London.
- 3. Volleyball on Wednesday's at MC London.
- 4. Ladies and female youth football & Basketball classes with a qualified professional every Monday at MC London
- 5. Regular youth meetings at MC London
- 6. Regular cards and pool sessions at MC London
- Playing Cards played every Wednesday & Saturdays at different venues in Leicester
- Weekly Friday Night activities for families have now been started and lots of people are attending on a regular basis with their families.
- 9. Football training for under 16s in Leicester
- 10. Indoor Football on every Friday in Leicester
- 11. Outdoor Football on every Friday in Leicester
- Talim classes for youth in Leicester every Monday at MC Leicester
- 13. Youth club on every Friday in Memon Center Leicester.
- Mehman Lunch Club at Memon Center Leicester on every Thursday.
- 15. Leicester provides free Memon Centre for funeral services.
- 16. Memon Association Leicester is going through a very large extension for sports centre, once we have our own purpose built sports centre completed will be able to increase our youth activities and invite Memon's worldwide for sports competitions In Sha Allah.



As can be determined from the above list, youth activities have been extensive and vibrant and further improvements are planned to the engagement with youth for 2020/21 ln Sha Allah.

GYW (Global Youth Wing)

In 2017 GYW (Global Youth Wing) was formally established with a structure to enhance the coordination and development of Memon Youth globally and to provide projects at a local level to interact with and benefit from. GYW was created with a vision to engage all Memon's aged from 18-40 years of age. To bring youth on board Europe Chapter arranged a function at the Memon Centre to launch GYW. Mr. Arshad Gani who is a Vice Chairman of GYW Europe Chapter in which more than 100 participants attended. In this event management of GYW explained about the new initiatives and future plans of GYW on a global basis. After this successful event lot of people approached and signed up a Youth member.

Ladies Wing Report 2019

WMO Ladies Wing has actively continued to support the on-going Charity projects in India and Malawi. For Ramadhan 2019 we have collected £8,000.

Projects in India

- Food Packs for Ramadhan were distributed to 300 families in Mumbai and suburbs.
- 40 Widows families had their yearly financial support this is a scheme for upliftment for the destitute families.
- Funds were sent to Lohara for the Girls Orphanage and Eid Kits were donated as well.
- Also, recently 40,000 Rupees worth of Rainwear and Tarpaulin was donated to the poor people of Mumbai during the Monsoon season

We have received acknowledgements from Razia Bai and Shabana Darvesh of India Chapter Ladies Wing.

Projects in Malawi and Mozambique

- 250 Ramadhan Food Packs were distributed to the poor in the village districts. Distribution was done by "Road to Relief" Charity
- In 2019 funds were sent to Mozambique for the Beira Cyclone disaster.

The sum of £3,000 was collected for Syrian refugees at the European borders and Yemen refugees for the supply of Blankets and Food packs for the winter months. Aid Convoy Charity of UK handled distribution.

Memon Connections

At present we are two Ladies from UK working on this project alongside the WMO International Ladies Wing. In the UK We have been doing four to five introductions a week and is a very demanding and time-consuming commitment. Recently at the Family Get-together Function at Memon Centre in London we managed to do few introductions and had positive responses.

Ladies Activities

There is Basketball for Girls on Monday nights and Keep-fit Class and Badminton on Friday Nights, both well attended at the Memon Centre in London.

Membership

Memon Association UK and Memon Association Leicester are assisting the WMO Europe Chapter to achieve its target to maximise the membership of WMO. In functions of MA London and MA Leicester WMO membership stands have now been introduced to create awareness within the community and senior members give five minute presentation to inform them about the projects being carried out in different continents by WMO. Also, with the introduction of new GYW VC and team executives in 2019 we have seen a record increase in Youth Membership category, this is mainly as a result of introduction

of GYW. We got new commitment from Memons to become members, but we are chasing them to pay their subscription.

Before the AGM in Dubai, UAE we had 140 members. Currently, till June 2020 we have 158 members including 5 Trustees (5 in 2019), 4 Patrons (4 in 2019), 72 Life (69 in 2019), 5 Annual (5 in 2019), 64 Youth (53 in 2019), 2 Associates (Nil in 2019) and 6 Friends of WMO (4 in 2019).

Other activities/matters of Interest

COVID 19 PANDEMIC RELIEF WORK

WMOCF is conducting a global effort to provide assistance and relief to the most affected by the deadly Covid 19 disease and as part of this dire need WMO Europe Chapter is playing its part to provide some assistance to mitigate the adverse impact of the pandemic. Some of the relief initiatives our chapter would be taking are as follows:

- Testing kits support to Pakistan and India
- Testing Kits support to UK
- Food Packages support to NHS (National Health Service) staff
- Food Package support to Elderly People

UK Memon Business Directory and Memon Census Forms

WMO Europe Chapter with the help of Global GYW team is in the process of creating a worldwide Business Directory and once completed all WMO members worldwide would be able to access the portal which in turn will benefit them in terms of buying and selling their products and services worldwide.

GYW Team is also working simultaneously to create an online platform so that Memon Census can be carried out which will help us creating as worldwide database of Memons living across the globe.

The Memon Association UK/Leicester and World Memon Organisation Europe Chapter are also carrying out activities such as badminton, ladies basketball, indoor volleyball, indoor football on a weekly basis so as to get Memon Youth involved.

They also hire venues externally so that the Memon Youth can get the outdoor experience in the field of Cricket and Football. An outdoor football activity has been carried every Friday for the youths of various age groups where an ex-professional football coach provides training sessions for the younger age group.

They have also organised tournaments and competitions in badminton and football.

Projects

The MICRO FINANCE SCHEME was started by WMO Far East Chapter in 2013 to support Small Scale Entrepreneurs in the community. Up to December 2019, over 100 Memons have benefitted through this scheme.

- Far East Chapter Micro Finance Loan scheme has started the 6th phase.
- This scheme has helped lending to over 120 Memons.
- The current total lending is approximately LKR 22 million as at the end of 2019.

 - Supporting to uplift sports activities, (Sport instruments, Practice Session, Coach salary)

 - WMO has a fulltime coordinator at Darussalam to assist this project
 - Total estimated cost for all the above schemes per annum would be LKR 2.5mn.
- b. Al Hijra Muslim Vidyalaya: This is one of the Oldest Muslim schools in Colombo with only 350 Students, which was in the verge of closing down.
 - WMO Provides English/IT Teacher salaries
 - WMO assisted restoring the damaged main school building with a funding of Rs. 1,200,000
 - The School requires WMO assistance for a 12 Class room complex with a cost of Rs. 30 million
- c. School Uplifment Projects: WMO FC has selected 2 Muslims schools in the Island, namely Fathima Muslim Ladies College of Colombo 12, and Al Minhaj College of Hapugasthalawa, with good Advanced Level Results and marginal university entrance. We have projected to increase the University entrance of these schools and to produce more professionals such as Doctors, Accountants and Lawyers to the society.

The Regional AGM is held mandatorily before the forthcoming international Annual General Assembly Meeting and provides an excellent opportunity for members of the region to be acquainted with the activities of the chapter that have taken place during the fiscal year.

The Regional Management Committee (RMC) which is the governing body of the Chapter held a total of three meetings during 2019.

While mentioning the projects and schemes run by the Chapter, it is important to understand that poverty in the community is a major issue. That is the reason why the WMO Pakistan Chapter is more focused on poverty alleviation. Since Education is the Key to Prosperity, the Chapter is working aggressively to alleviate poverty by promoting Education. The WMO fully understands that quality school education will open new avenues for onward higher education, fruitful careers and self-sufficiency. The Chapter believes that education will transform the lives of not only the student but the entire family.

A mega project called the WMO EDUCATION FOR ALL SCHEME has been active since 2008 to provide financial assistance to thousands of school-going children from Montessori to Intermediate Level. Financial assistance is provided under One-Window Operation, with many



educational partners involved. These educational partners include the WMO International, specially the WMO Middle East Chapter, the WMOPC Ladies Wing, donors, well-wishers and numerous Jamats, who contribute a mutually agreed percentage of the fees, and the educational institutions offer discounts and waivers. Major reforms have been initiated to streamline this Education Scheme and to make it more effective.

Similarly, the WMO HIGHER AND PROFESSIONAL EDUCATION SCHEME which was launched in 2005 is helping hundreds of needy students to pursue college and professional education. Looking back at the last 15 years, we are pleased to see the progress made by scores of students, who after successfully completing their studies, are well-placed in their careers. They are now financially secure and their success has broughtin a dramatic improvement in the quality of life of their immediate family members. Special thanks to WMO Middle East Chapter, WMOPC Ladies Wing, the Iqra University and other Universities for their continuous support.

After discussions with WMO's International Office Bearers, it was decided to conduct a DIAGNOSTIC REVIEW of both Higher Education Scheme and the Education for All Scheme and also develop new software. It is hoped that the Diagnostic Review and Software Development will be completed in 2020.

Another proud mega project of WMO Pakistan Chapter is the MEMON INDUSTRIAL & TECHNICAL INSTITUTE (MITI) which is focused on providing vocational and technical training, especially for those men and women who could not complete their formal education. MITI was a dream of Founder-President, Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob (ARY) which has come true.

After its formal launch in May 2009, MITI has come a long way and has now become one of the leading Vocational Training Centers in Pakistan. Thousands of students qualify in different trades every year and are easily absorbed in the job market or become self-employed. The Government of Pakistan, the Provincial Governments, Embassies & Consulates of various countries and numerous national & international organizations have acknowledged the valuable humanitarian services rendered by MITI and have extended every possible support and cooperation to MITI. Many have signed MoUs to work jointly on various training projects.

As you are aware that WMO has always emphasized that the real assets of the community are the Memon youth and that much more has to be done for them. For this purpose, the WMO International has launched the GLOBAL YOUTH WING (GYW) under the capable Chairmanship of Mr. Bashir Sattar. The GLOBAL YOUTH WING (GYW) AT WMO PAKISTAN CHAPTER is very active in facilitating the youth by organizing seminars and other events to motivate the youth and to expose them to the experience and expertise of noted Memon personalities and to open new avenues of opportunity and skills for them.

The LADIES WING AT WMO PAKISTAN CHAPTER is also playing its important role in empowering Memon women. The Ladies Wing always actively participates in fundraising, membership campaigns and welfare projects of WMOPC. Their active participation in all endeavors of WMO Pakistan Chapter is well-appreciated and welcomed by all.

Another feather in the cap of WMO Pakistan Chapter is the WMOPC GIFT OF SIGHT PROJECT. It is a noble and unique project by which hundreds of desperate and hopeless people have had their vision restored through Cornea Transplants. The Gift of Sight project is a joint endeavor with the WMO Far East Chapter in collaboration with Hashmani's Eye Hospital and Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital of Karachi. Cornea from Sri Lanka, under the aegis of WMO Far East Chapter, is flown to Karachi. Patients in Pakistan who are suffering from corneal disorders are provided with Cornea Transplants free of cost with Pakistan Chapter bearing the expenses. The Pakistan Chapter has raised around US\$ 44,000 locally since inception of the project and has provided financial support for Cornea Transplants of around 200 patients.

WMOPC ELIMINATION OF THALASSEMIA PROJECT is a vision to usher in a Thalassemia Major Free Pakistan. Although there are numerous organisations in Pakistan which are working for thalassemia, most of them focus only on treatment whereas WMOPC is focusing on its elimination. In 2013, the All Pakistan Memon Federation (APMF) had passed a resolution to completely eliminate Thalassemia from the Memon Community. It had urged all Jamats to work jointly for this

purpose. The WMO Pakistan Chapter is already playing its role in this noble cause and is urging for greater cooperation and coordination amongst all concerned Jamats and bodies. The Dawat-e-Islami, a global non-political Islamic Organization based in Karachi, is also working along with WMO against the fight against Thalassemia and has screened thousands of its students, staff and other people.

WMOPC EMPOWERMENT THROUGH INCLUSION PROJECT: Children with disabilities are called Special Children or Persons with Disabilities (PWD). Unfortunately, the society is not doing enough for these children. The WMO Pakistan Chapter fully understands this problem and is determined to do its best to help these unfortunate children by providing them with the best available treatment and therapies. The project named Empowering through Inclusion was started in May 2018 with the collaboration of WMO North America Chapter.

The WMOPC DISTRIBUTION OF QURBANI MEAT SCHEME has been formed to distribute Qurbani Meat to deprived families in Karachi, Hyderabad, Thatta and Sukkur. This project is a joint venture of WMOPC and Khadim-e-Insaniyat Welfare Trust. Out of the total 110 cows distributed, WMO had contributed amount for 49 cows. The number of cows is expected to grow every year as more people become aware of this scheme. The WMOPC Ladies Wing has actively contributed to this scheme for which we are thankful to them.

Distribution of Rations during Ramadan under the WMOPC DISTRIBUTION OF RAMADAN RATION SCHEME has been going on since a long time. We are thankful to WMO Middle East Chapter and the WMOPC Ladies Wing for their generous contributions. In the year 2019, the procedure for distribution was reviewed and amended. Alhamdulillah, the Jamats are now more actively involved.

Regarding distribution of Zakat, our respected Mr. Farooq Ahmed of UAE initiated the tradition of distributing Zakat to deserving families through WMOPC. In the year 2018, the policy of distribution through the WMOPC ZAKAT DISTRIBUTION SCHEME was revised and now the distribution of the Zakat is done through the channel of Jamaats.

The WMOPC REHABILITATION SCHEME at Pakistan Chapter is one of the earliest welfare schemes launched by WMO anywhere in the world. When this scheme was launched in 2004, it received a tremendous response. In the early days, many flats were given to deserving families. As per SOPs, files of these flats are being handed over to the applicants. Nowadays, since there is a lack of funds and the cost of apartments is very high, the WMOPC is not providing flats but is supporting about 50 families with monthly house rent.

The WMOPC ROZGAR MOTORCYCLE SCHEME is another project which has been launched in the end of 2019. Under this scheme, around 200 motorcycles will be distributed during the year 2020 to underprivileged Memon brothers so that they can earn a decent livelihood by seeking employment in various online ride-booking and delivery service companies. We are thankful to N.J. Autos (Super Power Motorcycles) and D.S. Motors (Unique Motorcycles) for giving us special offer for the motorcycles. Besides, WMOPC will negotiate with various On Demand Ride Hailing and Parcel Delivery Services like BYKEA to come up with best deals for our Memon brothers.

Another scheme which will be launched in early 2020 is the WMOPC BRIDAL DRESS SCHEME wherein slightly used/one-time used bridal and party dresses from North America will be offered free of cost to less-fortunate brides-to-be. Thanks to WMO North America Chapter (WMONA), especially Mrs. Zahida Taufiq, Chairperson, WMONA Ladies Wing, for their immense support for this project. For this purpose, meetings were held in 2019 itself.

The WMO Pakistan Chapter always recognizes the outstanding achievements of Memon men and women from all walks of life. High Achievers in education, sports, business, social work and other fields are given the WMOPC MEMON COMMUNITY HIGH ACHIEVERS' AWARDS. During the year 2019, Gold Medals were given to Memon businessmen who had received the Sitara-e-Imtiaz Awards and the Top Tax Payers of the Country Awards from the Government of Pakistan. Shields were also given to a few Memon youth who were high-achievers in sports and studies. Besides the above, a special AWARD CEREMONY was organized to honor Youth Volunteers and our very own Office Staff wherein 350 certificates and gifts were given. Special thanks to Bonanza Garments for contributing the gifts.



In the end, I wish to point out that the welfare activities of WMOPC would not have been possible without the continuous support and encouragement of so many concerned. I wish to thank each one of them individually.

First of all I sincerely thank Almighty Allah for giving us the strength and guidance. Regional Annual General Meeting Of WMOPC

The Regional Annual General Meeting (RAGM) of WMO Pakistan Chapter was held on Friday, 13th September 2019 at 7.30 pm at the Rangoonwala Community Center, Dhoraji, Karachi. The meeting was attended by about 80 persons which included Members of the Regional Management Committee (RMC), Trustees, Patrons, Life Members, Annual Members, Representatives from Apex Bodies & Jamats and observers.

The Minutes of the previous RAGM and the Audited Accounts for the year ended 31st December 2018 were approved. The Auditors AF Ferguson & Co were reappointed for the year 2019. The Meeting was followed by Dinner.

The 17th Annual General Assembly Meeting Of WMO Held At Dubai, Uae From 31st October To 2nd November 2019

The 17th international Annual General Assembly Meeting (AGAM) of WMO was hosted by the WMO Middle East from 31st October to 2nd November 2019 at Hotel Metropole, Dubai, UAE. Over 200 international delegates attended from nine chapters of WMO located in North America, Europe, Middle East, Africa, Far East, India and the host country, Pakistan.

Other meetings included the Meetings of the Board of Trustees, Board of Management Committee, Global Youth Wing and the International Ladies Wing. The AGAM and other meetings endorsed WMO as the truly global, umbrella organization which unites Memons from all corners of the world on a single platform.

Gift of Sight

A Joint Project of WMO Far East Chapter and WMO Pakistan Chapter.

It is, indeed, an honor to be selected as the Chairman of the Gift of Sight Committee. No doubt, it is a team effort and I wish to sincerely thank first of all the WMO Far East Chapter and then my team members, especially Mr. Shoaib Ghaziani and Mr. Qasim Lawai, for successfully running this project.

My sincere thanks are also to Mr. Shoaib Ismail Mangroria (Secretary General, WMO), Mr. Altaf Habib Jangda (Acting VP & Regional Secretary General, WMOPC) and Mr. Gul Muhammad (Regional Treasurer, WMOPC), who are always supportive more than my expectations.

The cornea is the transparent outermost layer of the eye with dome shaped surface and plays an important role in vision. In some patients, the cornea gets damaged and hinders clarity of vision.

Nowadays, it is possible to replace the cornea via a transplant surgery to restore the vision of the patient to a greater percentage of clarity.

The Gift of Sight Project of WMO, which was launched in February 2018, aims to provide Gift of Sight by free of cost transplants of Cornea to deserving patients.

This project is a joint venture between WMO Far East Chapter and WMO Pakistan Chapter along with Partner Hospitals in Karachi namely Hashmani's Eye Hospital and Al Ibrahim Eye Hospital.

- The Cornea is transported by air from Sri Lanka to Karachi by WMO Far East Chapter.
- After the cornea arrives at the Karachi Airport, the WMO
 Pakistan Chapter takes over and bears all expenses which
 include Clearing at the Airport, safe transportation to the
 hospital and costs incurred on the patients for the diagnosis,
 transplant/surgery and post-operative follow-up.
- WMO has partnered with two of the best Eye Hospitals in Karachi namely Hashmani's Eye Hospital, M.A. Jinnah Road and Al Ebrahim Eye Hospital, Malir. Both hospitals provide excellent services right from diagnosis to cornea transplants to post-operative follow-up.
- The approximate cost of this project on WMOPC comes to PKR 10 million, which is based on approximately 250 surgeries at the rate of PKR 40,000 per surgery.
- These costs are increasing day by day and the WMOPC will soon be holding discussions with the partner hospitals to review and revise the rates so that quality of treatment is not hindered.
- Funding for this project is sufficient and there is no immediate need for funds. We are pleased to announce that the Gift of Sight Project is one of the most selfsufficient projects of WMOPC.
- So far 189 cases have been treated as on 31st December 2019 at a cost of PKR 6,805,000 (US \$ 44,000) which has been totally collected locally.
- 8. The success ratio at both hospitals is remarkably good.
- We have tried our best to give preference to patients belonging to the Memon Community but cornea transplant cases are not so common in the Memon Community, which is a good sign.
- 10. However, we have observed many cases of Retina Detachment and Retina related surgeries in the community. One of the Trustees of WMO has encouraged us to add to our Project diagnosis, treatment and surgery related to Retina problems, and has assured us of full financial assistance.

We welcome any feedback and suggestions for the improvement of this project.



Meeting Of The Gift Of Sight Committee

On Wednesday, 21st of August 2019, the Chairman of Gift of Sight Committee, Mr. Reyaz Ahmed, along with his team met with Mr. Arsalan Hashmani, CEO of Hashmani's Hospital, Karachi and his team. Various policy matters and future line of action were discussed.

3rd September: Presentation on various eye diseases by hashmani's hospital.

Visit Of Regional General Secretary To Hashmani's Hospital: Mr. Altaf Habib Jangda, Regional Secretary General, WMO Pakistan Chapter paid a visit to the Hashmani's Eye Hospital on Thursday, 5th September 2019 and met with the CEO of the hospital, Mr. Arsalan Hashmani and his team. Mr. Altaf Jangda was shown around the hospital and matters regarding the WMO Gift of Sight Project were discussed. It may be noted that Hashmani's Eye Hospital is offering generous discounts for Cornea Transplant Cases referred by WMO.

Elimination of Thalassemia from Memon Community

Thalassemia and Pakistan: In Pakistan approximately 6% of our population has Thalassemia Minor, i.e. more than 10 million individuals. The number of Thalassemia Minor Patients is expected to increase at the rate of 350,000 per annum. Besides, more than 5000 babies are born with Thalassemia Major every year. Unfortunately, there is no proper reporting for Thalassemia Minor or Major patients, all the figures are estimated and based only on urban studies.

Thalassemia and World Memon Organisation: In the year 2018, WMOPC decided to work on Thalassemia and nominated Mr. Usman Pardesi as Chairman of the Committee, who is well-known as Babae-Thalassemia in Memon Community of Pakistan. The committee is in touch with various thalassemia centers including Help International, Burhani Blood Bank and Al Mustafa Welfare center.

Objective

- The main objective of project is to identify thalassemia carriers (also called minor) individuals.
- 2. It was decided to arrange awareness sessions and thalassemia screening camps at:
 - a. Memon Jamaats events
 - b. Schools
 - c. Colleges
 - d. Industries
 - e. Madaris
 - f. General Public
 - g. Awareness through T.V Talk Shows
 - h. Awareness through Social Media

For this purpose, the committee held meetings with the following well known organisations of Karachi:

- Husaini Blood Bank (a leading Blood Bank and Thalassemia Center)
- b. SHED Foundation (One of the largest health welfare support center in Karachi)
- Many other Thalassemia Centers and representatives of various organizations.

The Annual Target / Budget: The first year's target is to screen approximately 50,000 students free of charge. The cost of this project is around Rs. 10 million.

Meetings

The Committee held regular weekly meetings from January to July 2019 to discuss the policies for screening and awareness sessions.

Further, a Sehri meeting held at Karachi Club on 31st May 2019 to discuss about the screening program schedule in June at Markaz Dawat-e-Islam.

Meetings With Husaini Blood Bank

- 18th January 2019: A meeting was held at WMO House to discuss the cost matter of CBC and HB Electrophoresis
- 22nd January 2019: Meeting with Husaini Blood Bank about procedure of screening and decision to start screening of 50,000 students by SOFT Test.
- 3. 6th March 2019: Meeting with Husaini Blood Bank to work the way forward.

Meeting With Shed Foundation

- 10th March 2019: Meeting with SHED Foundation to discuss about Thalassemia screening at Markaz Dawat-e-Islam
- 25th June 2019: A follow-up meeting was held with Mr. Munaf Allana of SHED Foundation and they agreed to join hands for this noble cause. After this meeting, they bought all required equipment before end of July 2019.

Meetings With Office Bearers

Many meetings were held with Mr. Altaf Habib Jangda, Acting Regional Vice President and Regional Secretary General of WMO Pakistan Chapter to discuss screening of 50,000 students and others. We were very lucky to have Mr. Farooq Ahmed from the UAE join us in a meeting wherein it was decided that the committee will start its project and will send letters to all Jamaats to create awareness of this project.

Meeting With Dawat-E-Islami

Many meetings were held with the team of Dawat-e-Islami. The committee also met with Moulana Muhammad Ilyas Qadri (Head of Dawat-e-Islami), Respected Mr. Habib Attari, Respected Mr. Amin, Respected Mr. Imran Attari. Also met with the local Shoura Members and Dr. Kamran and many others for the deliberation about the awareness and screening of Thalassemia.

5th April 2019: Meeting held at Markaz Dawat-e-Islami for Thalassemia Screening at Markaz-e- Madinah for their students, staff and teachers. They principally agreed and advised to start after Eid-ul-Fitr in July 2019.

25th June 19: Dawat-e-Islami agreed to start Thalassemia Screening at Markaz Dawat-e-Islami from 1st July 2019 with the target of 30,000 students, teachers and staff members.

Visits To Thalassemia Centers

Committee members visited various Thalassemia Centers namely Kutiyana Memon Hospital, Help International, Husaini Blood Bank and Burhani Thalassemia Center.

Achievements

- During the year, the committee screened about 15,000 students in various schools of Karachi including Raunaq-e-Islam Schools, Kutiyana Memon Schools, MEB Schools, etc and also in remote areas.
- Screening camps at Dawat-e-Islami.
- Also arranged some camps at events organized by Jamats.

Blood Donation Camps

More than 125,000 thalassemia major patients are in Pakistan, each patient needs approx. 20 units of blood annually. They need at least 2.5 million units of blood collectively. Blood is not easily available in our country. If any patient needs blood for transfusion then he/she has to bring a healthy volunteer blood donor themselves. Families having thalassemic patients are facing lots of difficulties in getting blood for transfusion. The Chairman of committee arranged many blood collection camps & Thalassemia Screening in industries, schools, hospitals and other organizations;

WMO Education For All Scheme

The Education for All Scheme has been working since 2008 to provide financial support to deserving Memon students from Pre-Nursery to Intermediate Level.

The following policies were adopted effective from August 2018.

- Jamaat Partnership: From Day 1, Jamaat confirmation is a
 basic requirement whereby Jamaats verify and confirm that
 the applicant is a member of their Jamaat and belongs to a
 family which is eligible for Zakat. From August 2018 onwards,
 it has been made mandatory that the concerned Jamaat
 also becomes an Education Partner of WMOPC by signing
 an MoU and contributes a share of the fees. Some Jamats,
 who have sufficient funds, have not signed MoUs with WMO
 and are supporting their students from their own funds while
 most of the Jamaats have fully accepted this policy and have
 signed MOUs forpartnership with WMOPC. It has now been
 decided that from academic year 2020-21 onwards, WMO
 will increase 15% of students per Jamat based on the data
 of 2019-20.
- 2. From August 2018 the following policy has been adopted:
 - Handling of Renewal Forms is through Partner Jamaats only who have the discretion of accepting or rejecting the applications.
 - b. Preprinted Renewal Forms of students are sent by WMOPC to Partner Jamaats in PDF format. Thereafter, the Jamaat issues the form to the applicant after verifying that the applicant is indeed their valid member and is also eligible to receive Zakat.
 - Applicants then go to the school for attestation, after which the form are returned to the Jamat.
 - The Jamaat, after proper scrutiny and affixing their reference numbers on the form, submits the same to WMO House with signature of OBs and official seal.

- The Education for All Committee decided to form the following Forums:
 - a. Jamaat Coordination Forum: All partner Jamaats were requested to send their nominated members to this forum. The objective of this forum is to establish stronger relationships between Jamaats and WMOPC and to resolve the school and students related matters. WMOPC typically calls a meeting of this forum on quarterly basis but mostly the matters of Jamaats are handled on phone as and when required.
 - b. School Coordination Forum: Since it is very difficult to handle matters of the schools, it has been decided in a Jamaat Coordination Meeting that another Forum by the name of School Coordination Forum be formed, which will consist of representatives nominated by each Partner Jamat. This Forum will handle all matters related to schools and also visit schools regularly on their discretion.
- We have annual maximum fees limit of Rs. 24,000 for students up to matriculation, Rs. 48,000 for Intermediate students and Rs. 85,000 for Special Children.

CISCO Meeting on 19th January 2019: The Chairman of Education for All Committee held a meeting with Mr. Jinini, Regional Director of CISCO and Mr. Mehdi Hasneen, CEO of Hunair Foundation to discuss scope of CISCO training.

Jamat Coordination Meeting: A meeting was held with representatives of various Jamats at WMO House on Saturday, 24th August 2019 at 6:30 pm.

The purpose of meeting was:

 To discuss the policy of "Education for All" (Education support from pre-nursery to intermediate) for the year 2019-20

Briefing about other projects:

- Empowering through Inclusion Project (Special Children Project) and to inform them about the various therapies provided to these special children along with transportation.
- Elimination of Thalassemia Project
- Gift of Sight Project (Eye Cornea grafting)

OBS Meeting With Mr. Ahmed Shaikhani, VP Of MO Middle East Chapter

A Meeting of the Office Bearers of WMO Pakistan Chapter with Mr. Ahmed Shaikhani, Vice President of WMO Middle East Chapter, was held on 18th October 2019 at WMO House to discuss matters relating to the Education for All Scheme of WMO Pakistan Chapter and how to improve the system and move forward.

Mr. Shoaib Ismail Mangroria (Secretary General, WMO), Mr. Altaf Habib Jangda (Acting Vice President & Regional General Secretary, WMOPC), Mr. Gul Muhammad (Regional Treasurer, WMOPC), Mr. Shoaib Ghaziani (Chairman, Education for All) and Mr. Saleem Surti (Regional General Manager, WMOPC) were present at the meeting. Mr. Mahmood Shaikhani (Deputy Secretary General, WMO) also attended the meeting via Conference Call.

Interviews with School Children and Parents

Twenty-seven students who are enrolled with WMO and who are studying in various schools were randomly selected and interviewed along with their parents at WMO House from Monday 16th December to Wednesday 18th December 2019.

The criteria for random selection included:

- The student must be in Class V or above.
- Only one student from a family
- The student must have secured 65% marks and above
- The student must have 60% or more attendance.
- Only one student from each school so maximum schools can be covered.

An Interview Questionnaire was filled and a short video clip of the student was also made. The students were asked about their studies, their school environment, their teachers and their future plans. The parents were asked about their occupation, family income, etc.

It is pleasing that all the students that were interviewed had very high hopes for their future.

Visits to Schools

Five schools in different areas of Karachi, where students of WMO are studying, were randomly selected and visited from 17th December to 19th December 2019.

Points that were studied included:

- The size of the school and each classrooms
- The student to teacher ratio
- The qualification of teachers
- The facilities like play area, hygienic water, clean bathrooms, quality of food in cafeteria, etc.

WMO Higher Education Support Program

The WMO Higher Education Support Program is one of the oldest schemes at WMO Pakistan Chapter. It was started in the year 2004 and has so far helped 1,587 students of higher and professional education. The students who have passed out are now well-placed in their careers. The quality of life and financial status of the students has improved drastically with the positive impact being felt by the whole family. Currently, more than 200 students are enrolled with WMO and are pursuing their studies in different reputed educational institutions of Karachi.

The Higher Education Support Program has only been made possible with the active support of generous donors. Many reputed educational institutions have also become Education Partners with WMO by offering generous discounts and waivers for students sent by WMO. We are extremely grateful to our donors and education partners without whom the WMO Higher Education Support Program would not have been successful in helping so many students of the Memon Community.

The Higher Education Committee also conducts Counseling Sessions, both group counseling and one to one counseling, to morally encourage the students and show them the way forward regarding their studies and career. The Committee also strives to get them internships and jobs whenever possible.

WMOME Offer For Higher Education

A Meeting was held with Mr. Ahmed Shaikhani, Vice President of WMO Middle East Chapter on 28th February 2019 at WMO House to discuss about addition of Students of Higher Education. Iqra University. The WMO Middle East Chapter has also agreed to fund up to 100 students for higher education. Mr. Altaf Vayani, Chairman, WMO Higher Education Scheme, was also present. The way forward for the "WMO Adopt a Child for Higher Education" was discussed in detail. The Scheme has already been launched and some activities are already underway. The Scheme will be fully functional in 2020.

WMO Rehabilitation Scheme

Karachi is home to a large number of Memon families. Although Memons are known for their business acumen and philanthropy, it is distressing to note that a major portion of the Memon population is confronted with numerous socio-economic problems, out of which lack of proper housing is a major issue.

Imagine living in a small house with a large family where the scene outside consists of unhygienic conditions like flowing gutter lines and foul smelling garbage, infested with mosquitoes and flies. The house from inside is a congested space with grown-up children with electricity playing hide and seek, a leaking roof and overflowing bathrooms. The only breadwinner of the family cannot afford to repair or even make the house more comfortable and presentable. This is the typical living condition of most of the poor families living particularly in Old Town and surrounding areas of Karachi.

The WMO Rehabilitation Scheme was launched in 2004 to address the housing problems faced by the Memon Community. As soon as the scheme was launched, it received an overwhelming response with 7,225 applications pouring in within a few weeks. The numerous applications are itself proof of the existence of large scale housing issues faced by the Memon Community in Pakistan.

WMO started providing flats on ownership basis to the needy families after scrutinizing applications from 2004 onwards.

We have set the following categories:

- For single widows living in a rented flat, WMO will pay monthly rent to deserving applicants.
- 2. Living in Rental Flats
 - Widow / Divorcee with large family
 - Large Family with 5 or more members
 - Others
- 3. Living in Flats on Goodwill (Pugree)
 - Conversion of Goodwill (Pugree) status to ownership status
 - Large family having congested accommodation
 - Others
- 4. Living in Ownership Flat
 - Large family having congested accommodation
 - Others



After consulting with renowned Ulemas of the society, the WMO decided to provide flats on partnership basis with the ownership share of 1% to 5% held by WMO and 95-99% share by the applicant to protect the property of applicant, who is unaware about the misuse of documents. Later on, it was decided to withdraw the 1-5% share of WMO and handover the documents of the property to the applicants after 5-10 years, as per policy.

Handing Over Of Property Files To The Applicants:

As per the above commitments, the WMO Rehabilitation Committee has been handing over the original property documents from 2018 to the applicants as per original file returning policy. Till the end of the year, we had returned 371 files to applicants, who meet the criteria.

The following policy is adopted for file return:

- To check legal status of applicant, if applicant is expired, the committee guides the legal heirs of the applicant to fulfill the legal process, after which documents are handed over to the legal heirs.
- 2. Property must be free from family disputes.
- If applicant is selling this flat, the legal status of new flat is checked

As per our procedure, we send a request to Jamats to send a list of deserving Members for cash distribution. The Jamats, after due verification at their end, send a list of applicants along with CNIC Numbers on their letterhead to WMO. On the basis of this list, WMO calls the applicants and asks them to come on a certain date and time. The Applicant comes to WMO on the day of distribution and produces his or her CNIC after which the donor gives the cash with his own hand.

Distribution Of Rations

During the year 2019, WMOPC distributed Ration Packs in three events. In the first event, the WMOPC Ladies Wing distributed packets of rations to deserving Memon Ladies at WMO House, whose names were provided by Jamats. In the second event, the WMO Middle East Chapter distributed Ration Cards worth Rs.3000 each, which were handed over to Jamats who then distributed the cards from their offices to destitute members belonging to their Jamat. In the third event, the Pakistan Memon Women Educational Society (PMWES) distributed rations to remote areas to deprived families.

Some Jamats sent their applicants directly to WMO House. The applicants then took the cards to a designated Super Market, where they were able to purchase rations of their choice for Rs. 3000.

Memon Industrial & Technical Institute (MITI)

A Tribute to the Founder - Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Gandhi Founder of WMO & MITI.

A report about Memon Industrial and Technical Institute has to begin with the man who had a dream to impact the less fortunate youth who could not complete their education. This man was none other than Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Gandhi, founder President of the World Memon Organization (WMO) who is well known as a business man who could hold his own among the biggest business persons in the world. His other passion was the welfare of the Memon community in particular but Pakistanis in general. He firmly believed that education was the key to prosperity of the country and supported all educational projects generously. But the project closest to his heart was the Memon Industrial and Technical Institute (MITI) which was his brainchild and dream. This project was created to impart technical and vocational training without regard to ethnic background or religious bearing and rehabilitate the less fortunate youth who could not complete even their high school education and were fated to become street children with all the risk factors involved especially leading to violence and extremism. Even when confined to a hospital bed in his last days, he kept enquiring about the progress of MITI. The initial funding for the project was also provided by Haji Abdul Razzak himself.

MITI Chairman's Review - H. M. Shahzad

I am pleased to present here an Overview of the performance of the Memon Industrial and Technical Institute for the year 2018.

At the outset, I wish to boldly state that Memon Industrial and, Training Institute (MITI) wouldn't have come into being had it not been for the initiative of one person, Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Gandhi (ARY) and the support of the then City Nazim, Mr. Mustafa Kamal in providing the building. My relationship with Haji sahib was that of affectionate mentor and student. During the early years of the millennium when I became associated with him, Haji sahib would often share his vision of a vocational training center for the deprived youth of society and he would talk about it with great passion. It was this relentless persuit of his dream that resulted in the creation of MITI. I was entrusted with its implementation and I am grateful to almighty Allah SWT for guiding me in this venture. Since that initial period till now, I am also grateful to my colleagues in WMO, particularly Mr. Pir Mohammad Kalya, Ex-Secretary General WMO and during the year by Mr. Lawai, VP, WMO-PC, Mr. Altaf Jangda, Asstt Secretary General, WMO-PC and Mr. Gul Mohammad, Treasurer WMO-PC. But mainly I was ably supported in my work by the MITI team led by Mr. Shahab Hasan, C.O.O.

During the year under review, MITI remained actively involved in the welfare activities related to technical education, vocational training and providing suitable employment to the trained youth.

During this period, we worked as training partners with a number of national and international agencies such as NAVTTC, GIZ, UNDP, USAID and others.

We also entered into the new field of Polytechnic and second batch of our students appeared in the third year final examinations conducted by Sindh Board of Technical Education and secured two merit positions overall from Sindh with a passing rate of 94%. This year the second batch has appeared in the final examinations.

Overall, the enrollment during the year was 3890 boys and 5402 girls. The number of courses increased to 27 for boys and 27 for girls.

I wish to bring to your kind notice that MITI is equipped with the latest technology equipment and highly qualified teachers but is charging very nominal fees from students including many full scholarships which does not even cover our expenses. I therefore appeal to you all to give your generous donations or zakat to MITI especially for its future development plans. May Allah guide us and help us in achieving the high welfare targets which we have set for ourselves.

Report by MITI Chief Operating Officer - Shahab Hasan

I am proud to have been associated with MITI since early 2010. During these nine and half years my focus has been to achieve financial stability and reduce dependence on financial support. MITI has a strong infrastructure and a well-qualified staff. We have leveraged on this strength to steadily increase enrollment by opening new trades and courses.

We at MITI are quite conscious of the fact that continuous improvement and development are the key to long survival and sustenance. The establishment of the computer department in 2012 proved to be a huge success and has become the cornerstone of future development. Similarly, in 2015, we established the Diploma Section (3 years Diploma of Associate Engineer). This was a bold step into the field of higher education and by the Grace of Allah, it was well received and two batches have already appeared in the final examinations of the Board of Technical Education and passed out with flying colours.

The admissions which started humbly in 2009 with 254 male students has now increased to almost 10000 to 12000 male and female students and to-date has surpassed cumulatively the figure of 100000. In achieving these milestones, MITI has not given up the goals charted by the founding fathers of WMO, especially Haji Abdul Razzak Yaqoob Gandhi and our untiring Chairman, Mr. H.M. Shahzad. As such there has been strict compliance of the WMO principles of charity, welfare and service to humanity. MITI fees are still highly subsidized for those who are able to pay and free for those who cannot. MITI is destined to achieve bigger goals in the future for uplifting of the lives of the less fortunate youth of society. Alhamdulillah, we have been well received by the various funding agencies and during this period, we worked as training partners with almost all national and international agencies notably NAVTTC, GIZ, UNDP, USAID and others.



The Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is a new approach, which is being introduced in Pakistan to recognize and certify the competence and skills of millions of skilled workers coming out of informal TVET sector known as Ustad-Shagrid system. This approach will enable the skilled workers to get their skills recognized and subsequently they will have access to better job opportunities and further education. In technical terms-RPL-refers to a process that examines evidence of past learning and experience.

- D. Human Recourses Development (HRD): MITI focused in this year for Human Recourses Development (HRD) with the support of TVET Sector Sector Support Programme and National Vocational and Technical Training Commission (NAVTTC) many teachers and management staff different advanced trainings for example curriculum development expert, National Assessors, CBT&A trainer, Master Trainer etc.
- E. Accreditation with NAVTTC: MITI declared in "A" Category institute in all over Pakistan and all courses offered in MITI declared "A" category standard courses National Vocational & Technical Training Commission (NAVTTC) Government of Pakistan.
- F. Memorandum of Collaboration with business association, Industries and Enterprises: MITI is signed more than 25 MOU's with different business association, Industries and Enterprises for industrial linkages, on job training and employment of our students.

Ardent elevators: They are active nowadays in the installation of an elevator in the Institute as part of the studies.

Christine Cosmetics: They have provided facilities for a new Beautician Clinic which will be used for conducting short courses in beauty and Cosmetology. They also provide their cosmetics for class room practice also.

Millat Fans: They have most generously provided their most popular Millat Fans for installation in MITI whenever requested.

Glamorous FACE U.S.A: They have provided provide their cosmetics for class room practice Workshops and short courses in beauty and Cosmetology are conducted.

Central Depository Company (CDC): As a part of their CSR activities, CDC has placed MITI as a beneficiary to receive donation for its programs.

The future

MITI prides itself in becoming a premier institution for vocational training in the country and the management and staff of MITI are committed in its continued growth to help the destitute people of society for upward mobility.

We are humbled by the achievements and are grateful to Allah SWT for quiding us in the right direction and giving success in our ventures.

Expansion and Renovation of Facilities

By the grace of Allah, MITI has completed 9 years of operation. In these 9 years, we have served more than 96250 students. The graduating students have been well received by the industry locally as well as internationally which is due to hard work and commitment of the management and our faculty team. To achieve these objectives, our workshops and other facilities were purpose built to satisfy the training needs of the time. To keep up with the time and

The time has now come when we are faced with the reality of the following:

Addition of new equipment: Many of the equipment and facilities have become old while new ones have not been added. The present facilities are falling behind the requirements and advancements in industry.

Computer hardware is another big area which requires up gradation. Our computers are no longer compatible with the software that are now available and have become standards of the industry and which we are teaching. So far, we have been coping with these requirements by local up gradations but this has a limit. This includes all the computers in our classes as well as the servers in the I.T. room.

New Courses: To remain competitive, it is necessary to keep pace with the needs of the students and employers and introduce new courses from time to time. We have not introduced any new course in the last 2 years. We badly need to begin the following courses which are demands of the industry:

- Industrial Electronics
- Instrumentation
- Fashion Marketing & Merchandizing
- Auto body Refinishing
- Alternate Energy

Expansion of Facilities: Besides the academic needs, there are needs of building and facilities.

Our power bill is very high. The only solution is to go solar. This solution is most economical in the long run but initial investment is high. We require USD 100,000 for this project.

The fiber glass roof is leaking badly and needs to be replaced. We also need a fully functional and well equipped Auditorium.

Your valuable contribution in this cause is the dire need of MITI which can rightly be called the flagship project of the World Memon Organization.

Empowering Through Inclusion Project

A joint project of wmo pakistan chapter and wmo north america chapter for persons with disabilities (PWD).

Objective Of The Project: To reduce the difficulties of special children and their families.

Education Of Special Children

Since 2008, the WMO Pakistan Chapter, besides providing financial assistance to less-fortunate students of the Memon Community, has also laid special emphasis on the upbringing and education of children with special needs.

In this regard, Mr. Farooq Bakali has been playing a pivotal and commendable role in the assessment of these children, finding the right schools for them and regularly following-up their progress. It is pleasing to note that Mr. Farooq Bakali is the only person from the



Memon Community who has the honor of representing Pakistan at the International Special Olympics.

In a span of eleven years, from 2008 to 2019, many special children have been helped to pursue education. Some of these special children have been transferred from special need schools to conventional schools. Typically, the WMO Education for All Committee was focusing mainly on providing academic education to these Special Children.

WMO EFA is supporting these children for their educational need. We are also planning to work on other issues of these children. In 2018 we met Mr. Abdul Razzak Pardesi through Haji Usman Pardesi. Mr. Razzak Pardesi, who is a businessman and philanthropist, returned to Pakistan from abroad with a Mission to bring change in the lives of underprivileged children with special needs.

He was already working on various such projects in Africa. He started Hydrotherpay centre (a Rehab Centre) and Chipmunk Special School in Zambia, where numerous Children and adults are benefiting since 2017.

Special Children In The Memon Community: It is a tragedy to note that there are so many children with disabilities and special needs in the Memon Community. Many parents do not disclose their special children to others and hide them in their homes.

Formation Of 'Empowering Through Inclusion" Committee: In the year 2018, a team comprising of Mr. Shoaib Ghaziani, Mr. Qasim Lawai, Mr. Farooq Bakali, Mr. Razzak Pardesi and Mr. Idris Salat initiated various meetings with various professionals which included Professor Shagufta Shazadi (Department of Special Education, University of Karachi), Mr. Amin Bhamba (Regional Director, Department of Empowerment, Persons with Disabilities, Govt. of Sindh), Dr. Raman Kumar (Pediatric Neurologist) and Dr. Masroor Ahmed Shaikh (Chairman Sindh Technical Board of Education) and discussed the problems, issues and challenges faced by these deprived families regarding their special needs children. It has been concluded that there is a need to address a lot more issues other than their Education such as:

- 1. Rectification of wrong attitudes & beliefs of some parents: Due to illiteracy and false beliefs, some parents of special children do not provide them with proper treatment and rehabilitation saying that it is all from God or that they are possessed, and leave them to their destiny. It is therefore imperative to educate parents about their special children and their care, and also convince them that their special children can be treated to a certain extent and their lives can be improved.
- 2. Improving the lives of special children by tracking, identification, proper diagnosis, treatment & rehabilitation
 - The first step is to locate these special children who are secluded in their homes.
 - After convincing the parents, the team at WMO has to take these children for a thorough examination and tests.
 - Thereafter, the child will be shown to a specialist who will examine the child and all test reports and chalk out a treatment plan.
 - Treatment will include medicines, further tests, therapies, transport costs and miscellaneous expenses, which will be sponsored for the child.
 - e. Regular progress will be monitored.

It was therefore decided to form a Committee so that a proper assessment and evaluation be made to address their problems and find solutions to make the lives of the affected families much easier.

As the saying goes "Reach for the Skies", we started in a small way and Almighty Allah helped us. On 2nd November 2018 during 16th AGAM at Avari Hotel Karachi, we had a meeting with the team from World Memon Organisation North America Chapter (WMONA). Their Regional Vice President Mr. Bashir Akuly and his team members Mrs. Zahida Taufiq, Dr. Sheraz Suleman, Dr. Naseem Sheikhani, Mr. Yousuf Pochi and Mr. Ghaffar Warind readily assured us with their complete support to carry out this project and they suggested the name of project - EMPOWERING THROUGH INCLUSION. Mrs. Zahida Taufiq expressed her desire to come back to Pakistan to work for this noble project.

Fund Requirement:

Special children project is a unique project but it is very unfortunate that it has been overlooked. We started a campaign to reduce the difficulties of Special Children and their families. We have estimated the initial budget to be as under:

- 6. Regular meetings with consultants, experts and volunteers.
- 7. Regular Visits to Institute of Special Children, at least once a week, we visit a special children Institute.
- 8. We also meet with special children and their parents at least once in three months.

Report Of The Conveners : Evaluation And Assessment - Abdul Razzak Pardesi

The purpose of evaluation and assessment is to identify or diagnose a special child's mental and physical condition. After this our team determines what the nature of their disability is.

We make a thorough plan for their education, rehab and support. Every plan differs as per the need of that particular child.

Experts then decide what therapies, medicine, nutrition, device or tools to be provided to them.

We have joined hands with various institutions and evaluators. Some of them are as followed:

- From 12th March onwards, a clinical psychologist of Centre of Inclusive Care (CIC) under the supervision of Mrs. Aisha Jamal has started interviewing by clinical psychologist. The process of them is to interview of special child and parents in two to three sittings by one clinical psychologist. We call 3 to 5 parents with their special children at WMO House and clinical psychologist interviewed them, the interviews of 20 families with special children completed at end of May 2019.
- From April 2019, the Peads Development Unit (PDU) of Liaquat National Hospital under the supervision of Dr. Raman Kumar, renowned peads neurologist, has started the evaluation, the process is very different than CIC, in first visit they arrange 5 experts like Clinical Psychologist, Speech Therapists after a week of this interview, Peads Neurologist Dr. Raman called the parents with child and discuss with parents about the matter of their children on the basis of outcome of evaluation report provided by his team. Till end of May 2019, they completed 30 full assessments at Peads Development Unit.

Report Of The Conveners: Outcome Of Home Visits - Zahida Taufiq (Chairperson of Ladies Wing, WMONA)

I am thankful to Chairman of ETI Project for assigning to me the Home Visits Segment. I came from USA and stayed in Pakistan for four months

from February to May 2019 to undertake this task. It was a unique experience in my life where I learnt a lot. I had opportunity to visit 3 to 5 homes in remote areas a day and visited 72 homes in all during my stay.

The objective of home visits was to understand the circumstances and way of life of special children.

The outcome of these visits was follows:

- 1. Mostly families are living in 1 to 3 room homes.
- 2. Joint families are common
- 3. Parents can't pay full attention to their special children
- 4. Most parents are not fully aware about the issues and solutions
- Most children were neither diagnosed or treated and were never examined by specialist or neurologist
- Some parents, specially mothers, were in very depressed and stressed state of mind.
- 7. Mostly children did not use any medication due to fund issue.
- Mostly children are special due to mishandling at the time of birth
- 9. Malnutrition is very common
- 10. Many family members, other than the parents, did not accept the special child as a member of their family
- 11. Some families have more than one special child, up to two or three

It is personal observation that most of the parents think that their special child is a flower of heaven or magma of hell. I distributed Mugs as souvenirs to all families on behalf of WMONA.

The basic problems of the Special Children which need to rectify are;

- 1. Probity
- 2. Early Intervention
- 3. Medication
- 4. Education at elder age
- 5. Activities after schooling age
- 6. Therapies
- 7. Transport for therapies
- 8. Vocational Training
- 9. Job Placement
- 10. Matters after death of parents

Through on site field visits I was able to better understand and appreciate the situation and dire need that may not be able to be messaged in other ways of communication.

Difficulties become more real and the dire need for assistance and intervention becomes more apparent.

Array of issues across multiple families some physical, financial or emotional. Establishing relationships with multiple resources for these various areas.

This project is near and dear to my heart. Through intervention we can change the lives of families. Thank you so much for opportunity.

Report Of The Conveners : Literature For Child Development In Urdu - Qasim Lawai

Finding books, research papers or articles on child development in Urdu language is very a difficult task. Unfortunately, there is no culture to publish such books, research papers or articles in Urdu language, which is largely spoken worldwide. It is difficult to find a valuable book on Child Development in Urdu. Keeping in the above deficiency, we had meetings with following valuable professionals to overcome the non-availability of published material in Urdu:

- Dr. Masroor Ahmed Shaikh, Chairman Sindh Board of Technical Education
- Mr. Amin Memon, DG Special Education, Karachi, Government of Sindh
- Mrs. Shagufta Shahzadi, Department of Special Education, University of Karachi.



After several sittings of meeting, it was decided to publish books and articles on Child Development in Urdu language to provide guidance to the parents about the handling of their kids. On the above recommendations, we have formed a "Literature for Child Development in Urdu" committee comprising of following volunteers to work on research and translation of books and articles on Child Development.

- Mr. Ebrahim Saad, a well-known writer and writer of Urdu English Dictionary.
- 2. Mr. Shoiab Ghaziani, our committee chairman
- Miss Kishwar Sultana, Montessori Directress at Raunaq-e-Islam School
- Ms. Humera Raheel, Head of Urdu department at Raunaq-e-Islam School
- Mr. Yousuf Bhuri, well on photographer and script writer translator
- 6. Mr. Qasim Moosa Lawai, social worker managing Raunaq-e-Islam Schools and girl's orphanage House.
- 7. Mr. Ayub Ghaziani as Graphic Designer.

The "Literature for Child Development in Urdu" committee started developing Urdu Literature on Child Development, by writing books and translation of existing books available in English, by customizing it in the Pakistani culture, which is a very rigorous endeavor. Mr. Ebrahim Saad has completed work on books in Urdu to provide guidance to the parents for raising their children age wise from Infant to 6 years of age, discussing the following topics:

Mr. Saad Ibrahim (writer of Paragon and Oxford Press) and start the work under his patronage.

- 1. Social and Emotional Development
- 2. Language, Communication and Literacy
- 3. Approaches toward Learning
- 4. Cognition and General Knowledge
- 5. Physical Well-Being, Health and Motor Development

The committee further prepared the following policy for the development and propagation of literature for the Child Development:

- 1. Prepare literature age wise.
- Translation of books and articles in Urdu Prepare literature comprising of local culture.
- 3. Composing of literature in InPage and MSWord format
- 4. Add some images to understand easily.
- 5. Add the theme.
- 6. Second review of literature by the experts
- 7. Gather all literature at a one place in print format
- 8. Convert all literature in PDF format
- 9. Develop and start a website for Child Development
- 10. Develop an application for mobile phone
- 11. Publish the literature online on our website and on mobile application for free download in PDF format
- 12. Upload literature on face book, WhatsApp, and other media

Alhamdulillah, our team has started working in the light of above policy since November 2019 and developed many books and articles in Urdu, which are under final review by the experts and will be available online by August 2020 in the first phase and will be available in the print format in near future in the form of booklets and books.

Speech & Occupational Therapies were started from 7th October 2019 at Liaquat National Hospital for 20 Special Children. Committee is providing transport expenses to some parents.

Report Of The Conveners : Sports And Children With Special Needs - Farooq Bakali

Sport is able to provide immediate and long-term relief to people with disabilities who are often plagued with health issues, poor social skills and lack of self-esteem. However, there are numerous challenges that prevent the disabled from participating in sporting activities. Its society's duty to remove barriers of participation for them, the enormous benefits

that sport provides to the disabled are not publicised often enough.

Sport and recreation is not about winning, it's about helping build stronger, healthier, happier, and safer communities. They develop strong social bonds.

Physical activity enhances cognitive function improving memory, behaviour, concentration and academic achievement.

On the other hand inactivity negatively impacts brain, health and executive control including maintaining focus, working memory and multi-tasking.

The Future

The Office Bearers and Chairpersons of various Committees at WMO Pakistan Chapter are constantly striving to serve humanity in the most befitting manner. Every now and then, a performance review is made to ensure that regular improvements are made to keep up with the changing times.

The Chapter also strives to join hands with other like-minded organizations so that time, resources and man-power can be pooled to reach out to a greater number of people and to achieve much bigger targets. For this, the WMO Pakistan Chapter is encouraged and supported by other Chapters of WMO as well as numerous other like-minded organizations, such as Educational Institutions, Special Children Institutes, Healthcare Institutions, Jamats, Associations and the Corporate Sector.

Future plans include Distribution of Motorcycles to deserving Applicants who wish to earn a decent living by working as Riders in On Demand Ride Hailing and Home Delivery Companies. Negotiations are underway with the renowned BYKEA which has agreed to offer a very good package for our Applicants. It is planned to distribute around 200 motorcycles in 2020. The scheme will also distribute hand-carts for use by Memon hawkers and vendors.

The WMO Pakistan Chapter has partnered with WMO North America Chapter for the WMOPC Bridal Dress Distribution Scheme, wherein slightly used Wedding & Party Dresses will be shipped in from the USA to Pakistan. The WMO Pakistan Chapter will distribute these dresses to deserving brides-to-be on the recommendation of their relevant Jamats.

The Education for All Scheme has been reviewed and some important changes are planned, which will be executed in 2020, Insha Allah. These include intake of 15% new students, improvements in the SOPs and new Software Development in light of the recommendations expected from Mr. Ashraf Usman, who is currently conducting a Diagnostic Review and Organizational Development of the Education Schemes at the Chapter.

The Adopt a Child for Education is the brainchild of the WMOPC Ladies Wing. A committee will interview students and, on approval, will recommend the student for adoption/financing for the rest of his or her education in the best of educational institutions. Regarding the Empowering through Inclusion (Special Children) Project, it is planned to detect more special children and consequently increase the number of children for treatment and therapies.

3. WMO AFRICA CHAPTER LEGACY PROJECT

Following the meeting held on the 17th August 2019 with most of the RMC in attendance and specifically discussing the future WMO Africa Chapter Legacy Project [Old Age Home for the needy] our Coordinating Team worked tirelessly to present all the necessary documentation,

video and presentations at the local AGM, which took place on the 15th September 2019. Dr Haroon Gutta, Mr Yunus Suleman & Mr Haroon Kalla introduced the exciting new venture at the AGM as well as the luncheon.

WMO took a moment to acknowledge the selfless work and excellent contributions made by most deserving participants of the organization. Awards were presented to Dr Taheera Hassim and the caring ladies of Jama'atun Nisaa & Purposeful Giving for their wonderful contributions in assisting the needy.

4. SOCIAL WELFARE PROJECTS

WMO Africa Chapter continues to offer financial assistance monthly to Memon and Non-Memon, Muslim families who are in dire straits. Their needs include:

- a. Funding of monthly groceries, rental etc
- b. Funding of electricity & water bills
- c. Funding of tertiary school fees
- d. Funding of university varsity fees & textbooks
- e. Funding of outstanding medical bills & medication
- f. Ongoing commitment to Widows & Orphans as the need

5. ADDITIONAL WMO AFRICA CHAPTER DONATIONS / PROJECTS

5.1. JANUARY 2019: Purposeful Giving in conjunction with WMO Africa Chapter have undertaken the following projects:

- Clamber Club Parties visited the Little Angels Nursery School to entertain the kids with activities that were stimulating for them at a cost of R2,100.00 sponsored by the 2 organizations.
- o. A daily sandwich program to feed learners who come



- from underprivileged backgrounds attending the Himalaya Secondary school. The labour of making the sandwiches was handed over to a lady from Pretoria who is an ex-cancer patient in remission in need of an income, hence we are simultaneously creating employment opportunities.

These devices would aid Amalia and offer her a better quality of life. Amalia has been diagnosed with: Dandy Walker Syndrome, complete Agenesis of the Corpus Collosum, Hydrocephalus, Cortical Vision Impairment, Scoliosis & Infantile Spasms. The devices included: an Inverto Standing Frame, an Ursus Stroller & a bath chair all specialized equipment for her specific needs. TOTAL: R88,000.00. We would like to thank Yusuf Kamdar who immediately and generously offered R50 000 towards the appeal and the rest of the monies was funded from WMO zakaat collections Alhumdulillah.

12. YOUTH WING ACTIVITIES

12.1. MARCH 2019

- a. On the 08th March 2020, two youth projects were successfully coordinated, one being a social event - movie night event for youth from the ages of 13yrs upwards. Overseen by Dr Ridwan Mia and the Youth Wing Team, fully sponsored by Mr A.B> Moosa, owner of Killarney Cinema.
- b. And the other being the launch of our first "Menstrual Cup" Project, overseen by Dr Taheera Hassim. WMO Africa Youth Wing in collaboration with the team of "MyCup" provided free silicone menstrual cups to girls at the Malebosane High School in Tzaneen. When the members of WMO heard about this project, many of them felt this was a very worthy project to invest in and funding was raised to expand on this project. The following Lillah donations were received: Haroun Joosub R5k, Feizul Ayob R2.5k, Sattar Dada R5k, Anver Carrim R5k, Khalique Moosa R2.5k, Abubakr Hamdani R2.5k, Akhter Moosa R2.5k, Kashid Tar R2.5k, Samad Essa R2.5k, Aneez Amod R2.5k, Rashid Tar R2.5k, Gulaam Abdoola R5k, Haroon Gutta R2.5k, Akber Ismail Elias R2.5k, Moosa Carrim R2.5k, Purposeful Giving R2.5k & Anonymous R300 = TOTAL: R50,300.00



c. Thereafter a follow up project took place at the Kgaphamadi Secondary school in Rural Hammanskraal in Limpopo. 72 matriculants had 3 hours of female health education from Dr Taheera Hassim together with Cara (My Cup innovator) and Tshepiso Lebombo (Facilitator in the Hammanskraal area).

12.2. MAY – AUGUST 2019: The aim this year during the month of Ramadan was to revamp the orphanages and improve their basic living conditions.

- a. Tarbiyatul Aytaam Foundation Orphanage: This facility is based in Robertsham. There are 18 recipients of whom some are special needs children as well as those that have been placed here because of abandonment and dangerous life-threatening family issues. The distribution included 20 comforters, pamper diapers, dental products and basic medication. The little children were asleep when we arrived, but we left chocolate cupcakes, yoghurts, crisps and milkshakes for each child together with a party paper plate to add some celebration and colour into their lives. Some puzzles, colouring books, crayons and story books. The following day, we distributed pillows and sheets for the complete makeover of their rooms.
- Al Hudaar: (Recipients Darul Uloom Zakaat eligible girls studying to become Aalimas.) The distribution included 16 comforters, 16 sheets and 16 pillows. They received gift bags (Abaya, shoes, perfume, scarf and snacks)
- c. Al Hudaar Orphanage: (Recipients 10 boys & 13 girls) This orphanage housed children between 3 and 10 years of age. They were in dire need of bedding and the distribution included 23 comforters, 23 sheets and 23 pillows. Each child received a personalised gift bag with the correct size garment (kurtas, abaya, toys, topi for boys and snack)
- d. Zuurbekom Farm (Recipients 20 boys) This orphanage was in one of the worse conditions seen. There was no access to a fridge or stove. They were relying on drop offs for food and none could be stored due to lack of fridges or freezers. They were also unable to cook themselves as the stove was not functional. The distribution consisted of 20 comforters, 16 blankets, 20 towels, 26 pillows. The appliances donated were a SMEG fridge (donated by Dr Taheera Hassim), KIC fridge, Chest freezer and a DEFY stove.
- e. Salmaan Farsi Orphanage (Recipients 52 children 49 boys and 3 girls) This orphanage was on the outskirts in Grasmere, isolated from the world. A request was sent for 55 pillows. A packet of Jockeys was also given to the housemother to distribute as needs be (donated - brand new)
- f. An-Noor orphanage Cape Town (Recipients 42 Zakaat eligible children- 54 children) Dr Taheera Hassim travelled at her own cost to facilitate this distribution together with assistance from the owners of FATI.CO.ZA (Muhammed and Ahmed). This orphanage was in need of an improvement in their basic living conditions. They were short of bedding, beds and cupboards. The distribution included 4 bunk beds with mattresses, 3 cupboards, LG washing machine, 42 blankets, 42 duvet covers, 42 sheets and Curtain rails. Farzana Mahomed (the daughter of Solly Noor) attended the distribution.
- g. Salman Farsi school shoe distribution A request for school shoes for the children were brought to our attention. This distribution took place in the evening and realities of these children were highlighted. They live in circumstances of no electricity or warmth. These children didn't have proper basic footwear. We distributed 64 pairs of good quality leather uppers for school.
- h. Twinkle Star ECD Centre, a facility for children with special needs at the TIBA Centre in Lenasia. These children required special mattresses for their cots, waterproof sheets and comforters to provide warmth during winter. The children diagnosed with Cerebral Palsy have impaired circulation and required warm comforters in this weather. These children stay with their families and attend the centre but due to the programme not being subsidized by the state, they have to bring their own lunch, books, napkins, toiletries and mattresses. Unfortunately, majority of these families are

- disadvantaged and living below the bread line. The distribution included 8 mattresses, 8 waterproof sheets, 12 normal sheets, 8 comforters and 2 floor comforters.
- i. Jellybeans Education Trust for Muslim Orphans & WMO Africa Chapter visited the Albadr Boys Orphanage in Lenasia where each of these beautiful children were spoilt with a gift bag filled with wonderful goodies, such as Eid kurtahs, school shoes, hygiene goodies (sponsored by AMKA Products) and much more including a fun filled party pack which lit up their faces.
- Nancefield Girls Uloom [Recipients 100 girls studying a 5-year Aalimah Course] were also presented with an Eid Gift Bag and hygiene products sponsored by AMKA Products.

12.3. AUGUST 2019: On Sunday the 25th of August 2019, the WMO Youth Wing, coordinated by Nabeela Gutta & Yasmin Gani started their distribution journey to two deserving locations.

They began at "EI Shammah Home for Abandoned Babies". The establishment was formed 12 years ago by a couple, whom after two years handed over the responsibility to the current owner, who is now running it for 10 years. Situated in Primrose, Germiston, the home currently employing 9 people (these include 3 caregivers), is a safe haven to 8 babies, ranging from 4 months to one year 6 months. They cater for Abandoned babies until the age of 3 years old and thereafter if the child was not yet adopted, the social worker in charge of the child's case finds a new placement for the child at another orphanage for more elder children. The home has a 95% successful adoption rate local and internationally. The grils provided them with clothing and toys.

The next stop was "Madressah Tul Banaat", the foundation located in Nigel brings an extremely homely vibe. It started with an elderly Muslim couple from Benoni taking in orphaned young girls and thereafter expanding to taking in elderly and abandoned men and woman, as well as vulnerable woman and children, growing the foundation to become home to 110 Muslims of all ages, both male and female. The foundation is now currently on a farm which was donated to the couple by a generous family. The children are allowed the opportunity to attend school, with two of the teenagers from the home already in university, the shelter provides all the children with transport to and from the institute. Relying mainly on donations, the Heidelberg community works hand in hand with them and the foundation will never turn down someone new arriving to stay. They provided them with clothing and shoes for all age groups.

12.4. OCTOBER 2019: WMO AFRICA CHAPTER in partnership with "My Own Cup" facilitated another "Menstrual Cup Project" on the 08th October 2019 at the Diepsloot Secondary school. The young girls were educated about menstrual cycles and the importance of contraception. The programme was very informative, followed by Q & A session discussing any female health related issues.138 girls received menstrual cups and were extremely appreciative of this initiative. The lack of sanitary towels can push young, menstruating girls out of school, resulting in absenteeism and an increase in South Africa's dropout rates. We were pleased to be a means of alleviating this problem by empowering these young girls with a simple product such as the silicone cup that could make a huge difference in their lives.

12.5. NOVEMBER 2019

- a. PROJECT MOHABBAT On the occasion of Eid-E-Milad-Un-Nabi: On Friday, O1st November 2019, the team of "My Menstrual Cup" and WMO Africa Chapter visited the Tembisa High School and distributed the remainder of the silicone menstrual cups. The girls were further educated about the Reproductive System and Sexual Health. The aim of educating the youth about these very important topics is to bring a positive awareness of all the risk-taking behaviours commonly found in South Africa. These young girls were particularly interested and excited when introduced to the silicone Menstrual cup, which has proven to be a life changing product to many young girls.
- b. Al Hudaar is one of the orphanages located in Lenasia from the Orange Farm area, which WMO Africa has supported throughout the year. When an appeal was made to purchase Abayas and Kurtas for the children's annual Jalsa, all the



recipients being zakaat eligible, WMO Africa Chapter immediately saw an opportunity to come to their aid. Yasmin Gani, one of our Youth Wing Members was ever so ready to assist and arrange the attire despite having a broken leg. On the 30th November 2019, we distributed the attires accompanied with a small gift to each child for their Jalsa in celebration of their achievements. The kids were super excited and appreciative of the gifts they received.

13. FINANCIALS: Mr Ashraf Dada [Treasurer] to submit detailed WMO Africa Chapter Audited Financials.

14. MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT: The BOM continues to strategize various ways of approaching potential members. The task at hand needs a lot of brainstorming and active participation and effort from existing members and BOM to promote the need for our fellow Memons to realize the benefit of becoming members, actively participating in its vision and seeing it become a reality.

The main aim of the wedding was to send a message to society to come forward and help the girls of the weaker section of the society to get married. The event was successful and was attended by dignitaries like film star turned politician Prakash
- In the month of May 2019 WMO Ladies wing distributed food grains and sarees to the needy and destitute to help them prepare for the holy month of Ramadan.
- On 23rd of June 2019 WMO along with the WOW group arranged a Charity event for women at The Leela Palace Hotel Bangalore. The funds raised from the event were given to the Cancer patients of the Kidwai Hospital Bangalore
- Tomorrow never comes, create your presence in such a way that the future bows in front of you. The WMO ladies wing distributed sewing machines to women in various colonies, to empowers them to be a helping hand in managing family expenses.
- The WMO ladies wing reached out to the senior citizens by giving them wheelchair for their daily needs. PAKISTAN CHAPTER

The Ladies Wing of WMO Pakistan Chapter is the oldest and largest of all Chapters. It has a large membership with very active and dedicated members. The following are the projects undertaken during the year 2019:

OUTING TO AL-WALIDAYN GIRLS RESCUE CENTRE

To commemorate the World Memon Day that falls on 11th April annually, the NAC Mombasa Ladies wing went for an outing to a Girls' Rescue Centre in Ukunda, Likoni on Tuesday 16th April 2019.

This project was intended to serve the following purposes:



- To have a membership drive and raise awareness about the group,
- 2. Charity distribution as per one of our items on agenda, and
- 3. Have a ladies pre-Ramadhan gathering.

A total of 35 ladies participated - both youth and older member categories.

The Rescue Centre has been established in February 2019, and currently resides 27 girls ranging from 10 months to 17 years old from Coastal Region, Kenya. It is an Islamic Centre and the girls are educated by volunteers from nearby educational institutions. It is maintained under the banner of Bomu Hospital branch of Ukunda.

In partnership with Bomu Hospital, and through contribution from well-wishers, WMO distributed bags containing personal items and stationery to each of the girls. They also donated amounts in cash to the Centre.

After visiting the Rescue Centre, the ladies gathered for a briefing, bonding and refreshments nearby, where they were briefed on the aims and visions of WMO, and a membership drive started, with ladies encouraged to register.

Alhamdulillah this led to over 46 members later registering!

E.A. OPEN 2019 JUNIOR LADIES BADMINTON

During Easter holidays, Memon Sports Club Mombasa held the East Africa Open Volleyball Tournament in Memon Villa from 19th – 21st April 2019. This also included a Family Fest for the ladies and children, which involved netball and badminton tournaments as well as cottage fair and carnival games.

Sports being one of WMO's aims, the NAC Ladies Wing pledged their support to the Memon Sports Club by sponsoring the trophies and awards for the Junior Ladies Badminton Tournament. It was a very successful tournament where a total of 24 girls participated, who were all awarded medals and the finalists awarded trophies.

RAMADHAN PROJECTS:

VISIT TO TUDOR OLD-AGE HOME: NYUMBA YA WAZEE

As part of Charity projects, WMO ladies partnered with a local charity organization founded by young artists, Artistic Hope Organization for visits and donations to various underprivileged areas during the holy month of Ramadhan. The first place visited was on Saturday 11th May 2019 to an old age home, Nyumba Ya Wazee in Tudor, Mombasa. This place is managed by Catholic sisters, and houses 44 old people currently. Donations and contributions that were collected in form of ration items, medical necessities and cash from various people and entities were handed over. Alhamdulillah it was a successful visit.

VISIT TO NEEMA JOMVU ORPHANAGE

Again, with Artistic Hope Organization, a group of our ladies visited the Neema Orphanage in Jomvu, Mombasa on Sunday 12th May 2019 with foodstuff, ration, medical items and clothes contributed by the members. The orphanage consists of 49 children, 7 of who are currently in boarding school. Two caretakers and some teachers take charge of the children.

The shelter is situated in a rural area. It is made of iron sheets and is in dire need of continuous assistance to have a solid structure in place. The ladies wing Mombasa has plans to consider this as a continuous charity project over the year, in conjunction with the male group.

VISIT TO JICHO LA HURUMA ORPHANAGE IN LIKONI

On Sunday 19th May 2019, we once more visited an orphanage in Likoni for distribution of food and medical supplies, in conjunction with Artistic Hope. The orphanage houses 24 orphan girls. This was yet again a very successful trip where the orphan girls were also gifted toys and sweets.

COMMITTEE MEETING ON WEDNESDAY 22ND MAY 2019

After the visit to Jomvu orphanage and realizing the very poor living conditions, we decided to take it up as our project in assisting in betterment of the place. This meeting was therefore held to discuss the way forward with that, and to plan on the calendar of events of the year.

As an immediate action, The WMO Msa ladies wing members are currently collecting new clothes for the orphans, to be visiting them before Eid to distribute what we collect with an aim of giving Eid celebration chance to those children.

It was decided for the gent's team to be joining in the visit, for the orphanage project to be collectively taken up by the entire WMO NAC Mombasa team.

WMO NAC MOMBASA - LADIES AND GENTS CORE TEAMS VISIT TO NEEMA ORPHANAGE ON SATURDAY 1ST JUNE 2019

The Ladies wing identified Neema Orphanage in Jomvu - which is in dire need of support, in terms of maintenance, basic provisions, finance as well as the infrastructure which is currently made of iron sheets as a continuous project until it becomes self-sufficient. The men's wing was therefore approached to get involved and take it up as a project under WMO NAC chapter, which was agreed on.

The members of the ladies' wing had arranged for distribution of Eid gift bags for all the children. An encouraging collection of new mattresses, bed sheets & blankets, cash, bags, prayer mats, pairs of shoes and clothes was registered. The gift bags which were then packed each consisted an Islamic attire, a set of plate and mug, a set of toothbrush and toothpaste, biscuits, sweets and a bottle of soda.

On Saturday 1st June, the core teams from the men's and women's wings visited the orphanage to hand over the collection as well as survey the place and discuss on the way forward. After surveying the place, various discussions were done on improvement of the entire facility, legal and regulatory discussions done with the caretaker and options on way forward discussed. The children were then distributed their gift bags with the hope of giving them a happy Eid, and this brought wide smiles on their faces. Alhamdulillah it was a fruitful and enlightening visit.

A brief discussion was thereafter done on giving the children an Eid celebration day after $\operatorname{Eid}.$

EID CELEBRATION FOR THE CHILDREN OF NEEMA ORPHANAGE – ON SUNDAY 9TH JUNE 2019

Alhamdulillah as planned; we had a very fruitful outing with the children from Neema orphanage on Sunday 9th June. They arrived at Serani Grounds at 12.30pm by a mini bus courtesy of one of our members and a hired matatu. The organizers of the Fun fair waived off entrance charge for them. They also dedicated the day up to 3pm for Orphanages so the children enjoyed all rides as they wished, at a minimal charge. They also had a scrumptious lunch of chips, chicken and soda - all generously donated. They went back to Jomvu very happy and appreciative at 3.30pm.

VISIT TO AL MARKAZ ORPHANAGE ON SATURDAY 7TH SEPTEMBER 2019

Following a request for Juzu Amma siparas through Artistic Hope Organization, Alhamdulillah three of our ladies visited Al Markaz orphanage in Mwakirunge, to distribute 100 sipara (juzu Amma) which were purchased from our sadaka funds.

The orphanage is supported by some donors and is well managed by a caretaker, Ustaadh Salim who founded it initially with only 4 children. It now houses 75 children. They provide religious and secular education in-house to the children, up to std 5 currently.

Masha Allah a very insightful visit. May the Almighty bless the efforts of all involved.

WMO NAC Ladies Wing Members' General Meeting

This was held on 4th November 2019 at the Pride Inn Hotel conference room, Mombasa. The annual reports were presented and way forward to the next year charted. Discussions on the upcoming event, Hands Touching Hearts, were also done and duties allocated. Heartfelt gratitude to the Management of Pride Inn for hosting us.

Hands Touching Hearts event on 16th November 2019.

These grand ladies only event was held at Forodhani hall with an aim of raising funds to support the facility improvement of the orphanage in Jomvu that WMO NAC took up to support from the year 2019. The event included a luncheon, entertainment, games and an auction of various donated items and services. Cards to the event were on sale, each at Ksh. 1,000/- and it was open to female members of the Memon communities. Through involvement of and immense support from all WMO NAC Mombasa female members, Alhamdulillah a wonderful response was registered with all 300 cards sold and all items in the auction duka sold off adding on to the success of the full day event! We managed to raise a total of Ksh. 468,960/- which will all go towards the facility and construction of Neema Orphanage.

Adopt an Orphan initiative

This very noble initiative was launched during the Hands Touching Hearts event, and was specifically to raise donors for the sustenance of the orphans at Neema Orphanage. In addition to normal sadaka and zakat collected from members and well-wishers over the year to support in various charity causes, the WMO NAC Ladies wing committee felt the need to have a day to day and monthly sustenance programme specifically for the children at Neema Orphanage as we later on look into investment options for their self-sustenance in the future. The programme involved registering donors willing to pay Ksh. 2000/- every month so as to enable a child get his basic meals and needs. Alhamdulillah an amazing response was received, with around 61 monthly donors! From the monthly payments received, the committee then arranged for supply of ration, vegetables, meat, sanitary items, milk and drinking water on a monthly basis. This is ongoing per month. May the Almighty reward all those involved in the contribution and facilitation of the project. Ameen.

On behalf of the Audit, Finance & Zakat Committee I hereby present our Annual Performance Report for year 2019.

AUDIT

WMO Consolidated Audited Financial Statements, presented as part of this annual report, is prepared incorporating the Audited Accounts of Europe Chapter, Middle East Chapter and Pakistan Chapter as well as South Africa, America & Canada, Far East, North India and South India Chapters for adoption by members.

We have achieved greater consistency in the policies adopted across the chapters and improved the presentation for better transparency and accuracy of the Audited Accounts. Since 2017, The Pakistan Chapter accounting policies and estimates have been revised to be in line with the accounting standards and recommended practices. Middle Eastern chapter audits remains to maintain the presentation intending to be adhered to the regional standards, our consolidated financials have been presented to remain to follow the international standards for charities. In sha Allah, going forward, we hope to improve on any further inadequacies and the Audit for 2020 will be in line with International Standards and WMO Policies.

Similar to previous years there has been close communication between the Auditors of all Chapters, Regional Treasurers, WMO Treasurer and Deputy Treasurer and WMO CFO in the preparation of the Audited Accounts.

The Consolidated Balance Sheet has increased by \$151,000 Compiled Statement of Financial Activities shows a surplus of \$164,060.

FINANCE

WMO has a cloud-based accounting platform i.e. Sage Accounting. The chapters are required to update the system online real time with an allowance of batch processing delay of a 2 weeks. Northern India and South India, yet to complete implementing this software for the current year.

Chapter quarterly Management Accounts were required to be submitted from this Sage MIS report extracts, where certain chapters have not adhered to these timely submissions. The attention paid by the Regional Treasurers and the RMC towards Management Accounts was inadequate. We hope the RMC officials would consider this and monitor the Management reports in the future to maintain the status of WMO as an International Charity

The implementation of WMO Policies has to be given a relook as the chapters need to appoint qualified individuals for this position. The policy framework and Check Lists for Financial Policy & Procedure to make the monitoring of the Policies easier. This could be used as guideline and to report on their compliance or contradictions of WMO standard operating procedures.


RMC Officials continued to complain about no permanent officials in chapter levels to monitor the implementation of SOPPs. As usual, Regional Management Committee office bearers were requested to

consider this as very important and support the implementation in a very stringent manner, most of the chapters showed limited progress during their tenures so far.

ZAKAT

The WMO Zakat Committee take this opportunity to express our gratitude to all the Zakat Contributors, for entrusting WMO to donate their Zakat. We pray Almighty Allah accept all contributions made by the donors, and to shower his blessings on them and their families.

Overall Zakat Collections recorded a total of over US\$ 3.31mn for 2019, Alhamdulillah. The year 2019 recorded a growth of 10% compared to 2018, with an increase of US\$ 310,000. Given the COVID 19 pandemic scenario, Year 2020 will be an even more challenging year for Zakat collections, as it has impacted the entire world. May Allah take away the pandemic and bring back the normal life to the entire world, and In Sha Allah we hope to do our best to collect the maximum from each chapter to strengthen our core activities.



Zakat Policy

There was no change in Zakat Policy for the year 2019, and the change agreed in 2016 of Project based Zakat Commitment policy continued in 2019 as well.

Out of the total commitment of US\$ 4,860,000 a sum of US\$ 3,310,426 was collected for year 2019. This reflects a 10% growth from 2018 (US\$ 3,001,125) but only a 70% success rate of the commitments. Highlights of the collections for the year 2019;

- Far East is the highest zakat collecting chapter during the year 2019, the collection has increased by over 50%. The donor's confidence over the Zakat committee is the main reason for the increase.
- 50% increase in North India Chapter collection.




- Middle East maintains the collections at similar levels, despite the Restrictions imposed on Dubai Banking operations remaining stringent.
- After 4 years South Africa has fallen short of the committed amount, and dropped closer to 30% in their usual collections.
- Pakistan's collections fell by 20%compared to 2018.
- Europe collections have been impacted drastically due to Zakat being distributed by the donors directly to the beneficiaries or given to the chapters in kind, this is a result of the various constraints posed by some of the countries.

It is noted that as in previous years the Zakat is collected mostly during the month of Ramadan which was observed again this year. This continues to be a challenge and we request the Chapters to get this irregularity sorted by pushing for collection throughout the year and not wait till Ramadan.

To be in line with the WMO accounting policies and best practices around the world, we have considered only the Zakat collection or distribution pertaining to the financial year 2019. The collections in 2020 of pledges/commitments pertaining to the year 2019, will be accounted for the year 2020.

The main Zakat Disbursement by the WMO central fund, was for India and Pakistan for their education and housing projects.



We have funded only \$ 100,000 to Pakistan Chapter, as per donor discretion of Zakat distribution, which is only from Middle East chapter for Education projects. Certain donations such as Rehabilitation & Ramadan help were donated directly by the donors to the Chapter either in cash or kind.

Funding of \$370,000 to India was for both housing projects and education projects. Certain donations were made directly to India chapter towards medical, empowerment or Special education needs by the donors.

WMO considers Education as the foremost activity and have utilized closer to 45% of the global Zakat, out of which around 22% was for Pakistan chapter Education, supporting more than 5,500 students from Primary to Tertiary education. Housing in Sri Lanka, India and Pakistan was 37% of the total Zakat spent, this has increased from previous years due to focus on housing in Sri Lanka. Indian Legacy housing projects were also completed and handed over during the year which was from Zakat funds.

Far East Chapter collection of over \$885,000 was used for their local Housing, Education and Medical projects. International Ladies Wing have also contributed for Empowerment & Medical Projects in India & Pakistan during this year.

Africa Chapter have spent 60% of their collections on local projects such as Widows and Orphan Help, Education, Bursary, Medical etc. Middle East Chapter spent most of its Zakat on Local Community Welfare Activities, which includes Settlements of Debt, Rental, Legal Cases. Middle East Chapter has assisted the community members of Dubai on resolving Visas and license.



WMO has continued to provide support for disaster relief around the globe with funds collected from various chapters. Far East and Pakistan Chapter continued to provide corneas for 200 recipients during the year from Zakat funds.

WMO have strived to distribute all Zakat Collected within one Calendar year as is required by Sharia.

Zakat Disbursement process

- The Chapters requesting Zakat from the Central Fund has to send the prescribed Zakat Requisition Form to the AFZ committee detailing the project outcome, the local fund contribution and requirement from the center.
- 2. The chapter has to send a report on the utilization of previous Zakat received from center: a) The Zakat requisition has to be based on the Budget sent by the chapters to the MC at the beginning of the year.
- 3. The AFZ committee members will receive recommendation report from the GM & CFO along with the summarized details of the usage and requisition.
- 4. AFZ committee then resolve on the approval or rejection of the sanction of Zakat to the chapter.
- 5. If approved, the funds are remitted via EFT to the relevant chapter, from UK or Dubai.

Zakat Commitments For 2020

The Zakat commitments for 2020 is considered to remain at similar levels of the previous year i.e. \$4.86M. This is a result of no firm commitment being given by the chapters.

Alhamdulillah! Our total funds invested stands at over US\$ 5.18M, a significant sum which will ensure the future success of our organization and help in realizing our moto "Serving Mankind". Our gratitude to our Trustees, Patrons, Members and Donors who made this possible.

WMO Investment can be divided into the following Investment Classes;

- 1. Property
- 2. Equity (Divested during the year)
- 3. Bank Deposits
- Mutual Funds
- 5. Islamic Bonds (Sukuks)

The source of funds for WMO Investments has been the Trustee Fees, Donations and Profit earned on these funds.

Property

This consists of the largest asset class and represents 48% of the total investment portfolio of WMO. The property portfolio is the investments in International City in Dubai, UAE in residential and commercial properties which enables us to receive monthly cash returns by way of rentals. Fair Value of the Property as at 31.12.2019 is \$ 2.490.695.

Africa

During the year 2019 Africa Chapter had only 1 property in its portfolio, which was a Donation from WMO Trustee.

Erasmia Property, Laudium Site

Land Extent : 2 Hectares

Donated by **Trustee Haroon Karim**. This property has received approval in principle for the site to be developed as an institution. And currently the next stage of zoning to be done and thereafter transfer to WMO name, which will enable us to book it in the Africa Chapter Balance Sheet.

Investments In Equity Market

African chapter have divested the investments made in Equity during the early part of the year. We have made a profit US\$ 17,000 from the sale of these share. WMO have no more investments placed in Equities with this divestment. These funds are now invested in Islamic Bonds.

Bank Deposits

A. Trustee Funds

i. Sri Lanka: Trustees' funds of \$ 750,000 from Dubai Bank Account was invested in Amana Bank Sri Lanka, as these funds were not earning any returns for the past few years in Dubai. Amana Bank gives a return of 3.75% per annum on average (this is invested in US\$) and the tenure is 12 months with a rollover option. The Total Bank profit earned through this investment up to December 2019 is US\$ 85,000 (funds have been invested for 3 years).

Far East Chapter Trustee funds as at 31st December 2019 amounting to \$175,978 (LKR 31,675,950) was invested in the form of Fixed Deposit at Amana Bank. This earns an average LKR profit return of 07-08% per annum. The total return for the year 2019 from this fund was \$11,680.

B. Education Endowment Funds

- i. MH OMAR Education Fund (Far East Chapter): MH Omar Fund opening balance during the year was \$651,128, this was invested in LKR Fixed Deposit at Muslim Commercial Bank (MCB), earning a return over 09-10% per annum. The return on this investment in 2019 was \$ 63,000/=. The return earned from these investments are utilized for education projects in Sri Lanka and the balance is placed in income earning deposits with the Islamic bank. Balance fund available at the end of year 2019 is \$ 655,275 (value dropped due to US\$ fluctuations with LKR)
- ii. Education Endowment Fund (Pakistan Chapter): At the beginning of 2019, the fund had an accumulated balance of \$ 191,917/- (PKR 29,555,178) and these funds were invested in the forms of TDR. The returns earned through the deposits are on average ranges from 5-7% per annum.

The main purpose of this fund to provide non-zakat financial assistance/scholarship to the needy white-collared students in Pakistan. However, to date the Chapter has not commenced the scholarship scheme and the returns are reinvested in short term investments.

C. North Indian – Project Fund: North India Chapter has placed the funds available for Non-Zakath projects in a Fixed Deposit until the commencement of the said project. Currently \$100,000 earning a return of 4-5% per annum. India chapter has not much of a choice with their investment with the limited nature of Islamic instruments in the country.

Mutual Funds - Pakistan Chapter

A sum of PKR 20mn (US\$ 129,870) was invested in Meezan Islamic Fund and NAFA Funds (Mutual Funds). These Islamic mutual funds are expected to gain a price from 8-10%.

There has been a fall in value of the Mutual Fund during the year 2018, however there has been a gain in the prices of the mutual funds during the year 2019. Therefore, we are hopeful that the market price would



increase for us to implement our exit strategy at the suitable time.

It is with great pleasure that I present the Legal and Compliance Committee Annual Report for 2019 and I would like to extend my sincere appreciation and thanks to my Committee members for their unwavering support.

Constitution Amendments

At the AGAM in Karachi it was decided unanimously that WMO must fix the short comings in the WMO Constitution. A special Think Tank was appointed with following members being appointed to this, namely, Nowsad Gani (Team Leader), Bashir Sattar, Gulaam Abdoola, Yunus Suleman, Ashraf Sattar and Solly Noor.

The Legal Counsel was instructed to put together a legal framework and draft the detailed amendments for consideration by the MC and General Body.

However, the draft proposed amendment was only submitted to the Think Tank a couple of days before the 17th AGAM in Dubai which did not allow the committee sufficient time to review and follow the procedure required for adopting the proposed amendment. The proposal after initial consideration by the Think Tank was put forward for consideration at the Board of Trustees Meeting. The Board of Trustees requested that sufficient time be given to review and express their views. Thereafter, there was no further progress made in this regard.

Furthermore, As reported previously the Merger of WMO and WMO CF has been concluded in 2015, however the dissolution of WMO post merger is still pending the transfer of WMO PC license from WMO to WMO CF with the relevant local authorities. One of the reasons for the delay in this is due to the Decision on the legal status of PC not been Finalized. i.e either PC as a Standalone Separate Entity (Not for profit Section Company) or as a liaison office. Moreover, it was also agreed at the Last AGAM that MITI was to be established as a separate Entity. However, no progress has been made in this regard.

Chapter Updates

- South Africa No Legal or Compliance issues
- Europe Part of the Main body and no legal or Compliance issues
- Far East No Legal or Compliance Issues
- North India Chapter Still pending constitutional compliance with main body. The chapter had proposed and approved amendments to their articles at their recent AGM. Due to the regional government authorities' restrictions the process took longer than anticipated.
- Middle East No Legal or Compliance issues apart from banking functions restricted to local function.
- America and Canada Still pending constitutional compliance with main body. The chapter is trying to minimize the anomalies wherever possible.
- Pakistan Chapter:
 - » Decision on Legal Status of PC still pending finalization. i.e a Standalone Separate Entity (Not for profit Section Company) or as a liaison office.
 - » It was also agreed at the Last AGAM that MITI was to be established as a separate Entity. However, no progress has been made in this regard.
- South India No legal or Compliance Issues

Constitution Compliance

While the overall compliance to the Constitution and Standing Orders is satisfactory considering the diversity within the chapters the concerns raised in the last Legal and Compliance Com Report of 2016 still remain, namely familiarity of the Regional Office Bearers and Board Members with the Provisions of the Constitution and Standing Orders. The New RMC Members may have not got themselves updated with the Constitution and there is a lot of room for improvement in this regard.

One area of concern is the implementation of the Policies. These Policies were developed over 4 years ago with the assistance of KPMG South Africa but remain un-implemented in all chapters and this matter needs to be addressed once and for all by all chapters.

My sincere appreciation to my fellow Committee Member Bashir Sattar Bha for all his support and commitment to carry out our task. In conclusion, I wish to place on record the appreciation of my committee to all the Office Bearers and the Regional Management Committee Members for their support and corporation to carry out our duties.

The committee was entrusted with carrying out a number of activities and deliver results for the following aims:

The following has been achieved for the year-2019

A Donation Menu was created on the Website in the early part of 2017 and expanded upon in the year 2018, to attract Zakat and Lillah funds online. A comprehensive list of projects encompassing the broad spectrum of humanitarian services rendered by WMO across all Chapters were meticulously listed on the Website for the benefit of the donors.

With a simple click of the button, donors, around the world could now contribute to a cause closest to their hearts after comprehensively studying the details of the project online. A human story was also attached to empathise with the cause and create awareness of the hardships faced by the less fortunate.

WMO Website (wmoworld.com): The popular WMO website keeps getting upgraded each year. The website's continual transformation has attracted greater traffic. In 2019 we had 18494 visitors to the website with 49,713 page views.

WMO Facebook (facebook.com/wmoworld): Since January 2016, the WMO Facebook page fan base has grown from 4,532 to 13,114, generating a net growth of 8,582 Page Likes.

"The Memon": A monthly e-magazine is published to highlight the prominent, global Memon personalities and update ongoing activities and projects across all Chapters of WMO. The Inaugural issue was launched on April 15, 2016 and till 2019, 29 Editions were published. Distinguished Humanitarians and Doyens of Industry such as Mr. Abdul Satar Dada, Mr. Solly Noor, Mr. Haroon Karim, Mr. Iqbal Sacranie, Mr. Yunus Suleman, Mr. Ashraf Sattar, Mr. Nowsad Gani, Mr. Gulaam Abdoola, among others have shared the Cover with the Honourable Abdul Sattar Edhi.

Over the years the popularity of the Magazine has grown by leaps and bounds. The cover has become one of the most coveted spaces, with many distinguished Memon personalities aspiring to grace the Cover. We are very humbled with the response and it's our constant endeavour to make each edition better than the last.

A resolution was made at the end of the year in 2017, that henceforth causes would be highlighted rather than personalities on the cover beginning with the Rohingya crisis as the first cover of 2018.

WMO Video: This visual medium was extensively used over the years and much emphasis was given to short videos documenting the pertinent causes throughout 2018. A number of videos were made as teasers for The Memon magazine including a special one for the ladies edition. A number of live interviews were shot on Facebook during the AGM of prominent members of the organisation.

The membership video was a grand success too with an overwhelming response to membership across chapters.

The important causes of education, housing and humanitarian aid were highlighted extensively through 3 short documentaries.

WMO YouTube (https://www.youtube.com/wmoworld): We have a dedicated YouTube page for our library of videos covering humanitarian endeavours and various projects of WMO in the year 2016.

WMO Instagram (instagram.com/wmoworld): WMO Instagram posts received a total of 124,593 impressions during 2019.

WMO Twitter (twitter.com/wmoworld): WMO Tweets earned a total of 38,00 impressions during 2019.

WMO App: A mobile App was created by Eazi-Apps, courtesy Mr.Zakir Daud and Mr.Khalid Jussab that increases connectivity, allows easy access to updates, events, programs and projects conducted by the WMO. In 2019 we had a total 72 app downloads. Top app users are from India (114 sessions) and United States & Canada (81 sessions) followed by UK (67 sessions), South Africa (58 sessions), Pakistan 55, Portugal (32 sessions), Sri Lanka (31 sessions), UAE (30 sessions), Kenya (24 sessions), Malaysia (18 sessions), Saudi Arabia (17 sessions) and another 14 countries collectively (53 seesions)

We have firmly established our mediums of communication with the WMO Website, Social Media, App and the E-Magazine. We have almost doubled our following on Facebook as well as readership of the Memon magazine in 2019.

Development a Priority and implement these Strategies to double the Members by end of 2020.

- Convert the "Friends of WMO" into Annual or Life Members:
 While this was proposed last year, the Membership Development
 Committees at the chapters have not been very active in
 converting the "Friends of WMO". This needs to be done if we
 need to increase our membership. Leaving as is could also send
 a negative message to these members that WMO is happy with
 them being just friends.
- 2. Accepting the Online Applicants as members: There are many applications coming in through the website. Serious efforts need to be made in registering them as members and then following up in order to convert them. All the chapters need to give due attention in accepting the Youth and Friends of WMO Applications. There are 1462 Youth applications and 554 Friends of WMO applications pending which will boost our Membership numbers.

- 3. Increase in Youth participation: Global Youth Wing under Bashir Sattar Bha is planning out comprehensive program for the engagement of Memon Youth at Chapter and Global Level and the RMC's need to support and encourage the GYW Projects to increasing the youth participation in WMO.
- 4. With the change in the Zakat Policy from 2017: While the Zakat Policy has given confidence to existing members, this strategy needs to be marketed and highlighted to potential members in order to draw them into the folds of WMO.
- 5. Conduct Road Shows Globally: We have hit a road block in North Africa where the registration of the Chapter has still not completed. While the VP of North Africa has already started spreading awareness of WMO to Tanzania and Kenya we will only be able to onboard these members once the registration of the chapter is done. The other Chapters need to spread the net wider globally, this is especially needing to be done by Africa (Malawi, Zimbabwe etc.), Europe (Spain & Scotland) and Far East (Bangladesh, Myanmar, and Malaysia). There have been commitments in the past by the respective RMCs to travel to these regions and conduct road shows, but so far no action has been taken.

The VPs of the chapters are requested to plan Membership Drives and the Office Bearers will ensure their support if required. There are many Memons out in the World and it is our responsibility to reach out to them and portray what WMO stands for and works for and this message needs to be conveyed globally, by presenting our past

projects and achievements and future projects and the WMO visions to be spoken to.

There are few amendments done to the online database system, but yet to achieve the standard of a bespoke system.


